THE TORCH BEARER **(25th September, 1914 – 6th April 2001)**

Chaudhary Devi Lal University (CDLU), Sirsa is named after Jan Nayak Chaudhary Devi Lal, the former Deputy Prime Minister of India and the former Chief Minister of Haryana.

Chaudhary Devi Lal was a veteran freedom fighter, a crusader against the British Raj and a symbol of patience and fortitude. He proved himself to be a man of action, be it in the freedom movement or the post-independence amelioration of the plight of the suffering peasantry. He was looked upon with love and affection during his younger days and with reverential awe in his later life, when he was popularly nicknamed “Tau”. The welfare of the people was a mission of Chaudhary Devi Lal, who strove hard to see the peoples’ power reflected in the peoples’ rule. He was committed to the development of the backward classes, which included farmers, the oppressed and women. He always wanted the present education system to impart true knowledge. He firmly believed that ‘Rural India is real India’. That’s why he regarded it as a ‘dharma’ (duty) to provide a good, balanced diet, necessary clothing and shelter to each individual. He firmly held that ‘true Swaraj’ means participation of the poor, illiterate, underprivileged and millions living in our villages. As the Deputy Prime Minister of India and being one of the architects of the State of Haryana, he initiated many revolutionary steps for the agricultural development. His services to Haryana and the country are indeed unforgettable. As Reverently called ‘Tau’, the Jan Nayak, a ‘Karmayogi’ and a ‘Colossal’ guide, Chaudhary Devi Lal’s principles and values will always inspire, motivate and guide the coming generations.

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UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

Established on 2nd April, 2003, CDLU, Sirsa is named after Jan Nayak Chaudhary Devi Lal, the former Deputy Prime Minister of India and the former Chief Minister of Haryana. This University, set up by the Government of Haryana under Act 9 of 2003 passed by the State Legislature, has a sprawling campus of 213 Acre, 4 Kanal, 12 Marla at Barnala Road, Sirsa.

The university has five Teaching Blocks, well-equipped labs, Vivekananda Library, five well-furnished hostels for boys and girls, Media Centre with a Community Radio Station, a majestic Multipurpose Hall and auditorium, Shopping Complex, University Health Centre and the branch of a nationalized bank, Guest House, Vice Chancellor's residence and 144 houses for the teaching and non-teaching staff.

The main objective of the University is to facilitate, promote and excel in Higher Education, Research and Consultancy in the conventional as well as emerging areas of knowledge. To enhance the standard of higher education and increase the research activities the University has been connected to National Knowledge Network (NKN) provided through one Gbps (optical fiber) dedicated line under NMEICT project of Ministry of HRD India. Wi-Fi facility has also been provided in the University campus. The process of admission is online and simplified. It is expected that the students will be self-accountable in furnishing the relevant information and will enter into Academic Programmes with full earnestness, integrity and self-enrichment.

The university at present has 62 colleges affiliated to it. The total enrollment of students in UTDs, University School for Graduate Studies and Affiliated Colleges crossed a total number of 42000. 29 Teaching Departments in the University offers PG-38, UG-26, Diploma-05, Certificate-03 as per NEP-2020 under budgeted mode in the area of Technology, Management, Commerce, Journalism and Mass Communication, Humanities, Social Sciences, Science and Education. Well-known, reputed and experienced academicians and professionals have been associated in preparing the academic curriculum of different Programmes as per the guidelines of the UGC and other regulatory bodies. Teachers of the university have wide national and international exposure.

The emphasis is to impart quality education by providing congenial and liberal atmosphere in the campus through the promotion of extracurricular activities. Sports events at University, State, North Zone and All India Intervarsity levels are organized. Students also participated in Youth Festivals at University, State, North Zone and All India level. NSS, NCC and Red Cross etc. provide scope for extension activities. Thus the university prioritizes to enable students achieving overall growth of their personality as professionals and humans.

University Vivekananda Library is well stocked with more than One lakh quality books and journals. Students can access e-books and e-journals through REFREAD online resources. The air conditioned reading halls in the University Library are open for students to study during night under normal conditions.

The University has adopted innovative methods in conducting University examinations. The students of this University have shown commendable results in academics as well as co-curricular activities. With the present pace of progress already acquired, the University looks forward to have a promising future.

The university has signed MOUs with foreign governments/educational institutions in accordance with the national drive for the internationalization of Indian higher education. The mission is to inculcate productive quality among the students who will strive for the upliftment of humanity at large.

UNIVERSITY SCHOOL FOR GRADUATE STUDIES (USGS)

National Education Policy (NEP) -2020 has provided an impetus to the changing horizons of Higher Education. The University has established University School for Graduate Studies (USGS) in Teaching Block-IV (Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Bhawan) in order to start new Programmes for tuning ourselves to the latest state-of-the-art in Higher Education. USGS focuses on Four Year undergraduate Programmes (FYUPs) to strengthen the graduate studies especially on designing, developing, execution of market and industry oriented demand. To benefit students, society and faculty, the USGS is destined to start undergraduate Programmes based on Choice Based Credit Systems (CBCS), Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) and National Credit Framework (NCRF) as per NEP-2020 such as: (i) B.Sc. Physics (ii) B.Sc. Mathematics (iii) B.Sc. Data Science (iv) B. C. A. (v) B. Sc. Food Science & Technology (vi) B. Sc. Fashion Design & Lifestyle Technology (vii) B. Sc. Physical, Health and Sports Education (viii) B. Com. (ix) B.B.A (x) B. A. Journalism and Mass Communication (xi) B. A. Economics & Finance (xii) Bachelor of Social Work (xiii) Bachelor of Performing Arts –Theatre, Television & Cinema (xiv) Bachelor of Fine Arts (xv) B.Sc. Yoga (xvi) Diploma in Cyber Security and Ethical Hacking (xvii) Diploma in Digital Forensic and Investigation. The holistic development of the students to compete the changing scenario of the world in the 21st century is of prime importance. USGS is committed to impart quality education comprising academic knowledge and technical skills to the students.

UNIVERSITY CENTRE FOR OUTREACH PROGRAMS AND EXTENSION (UCOPE)

Ambitious Metamorphosis of the University can be achieved by way of establishing a couple of Special Purpose Vehicles (SPVs); one of them is the University Centre for Outreach Programs and Extension (UCOPE), which has been recently established in Teaching Block-IV (Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Bhawan) of the university.

The UCOPE envisions to employ education and technology for:

- Inculcating basic skills among students;
- Facilitating avenues for training and placement of the students;
- Conducting Outreach and Extension Programmes by undertaking training and consultancy services;
- Setting up Centres for focus areas like Gender Studies, Rural Development etc. and Chairs in the name of celebrated leaders.
- All activities that have hitherto called extracurricular and co-curricular, the academic aspects of such activities will be managed by UCOPE.

The Centre will fill up the gap of skill enrichment and university extension and outreach endowment as envisaged in NEP-2020.

UNIVERSITY CENTRE FOR RURAL STUDIES (UCRS)

Chaudhary Devi Lal University Sirsa is located in the rural hinterland and therefore considered to be educationally backward. The economic life of the university's catchment area in the Sirsa and Fatehabad districts (the colleges of these districts are affiliated to this University) of Haryana state, Bhatinda, Mansa and Barnala districts of Punjab state and Hanumangarh and Sri Ganga Nagar districts of Rajasthan primarily dependents upon on agriculture activities. The rural demographic character of the University necessitates conducting and promoting studies in rural affairs. Thus, the rationale for setting up the Centre for Rural Studies. The Centre will be headed by a Director (equivalent to the rank of Professor and should have experience of rural affairs related research studies) with adequate staff and own office. The UCRS will:

- a) Prepare, develop and deliver academic programs focusing on rural affairs.
- b) Promote research in rural affairs.
- c) Institute award for excellent research work in rural affairs.
- d) Conduct training programs for elected representatives of PRIs and officials engaged in delivering services to rural people or engaged in rural development.

VIVEKANANDA LIBRARY

Vivekananda Library came into existence in the year 2003. At present, it has an impressive four storey building. The present building of library is easily approachable. Beautiful lawns, add to its grandeur. Special attention is given to the facilities of drinking water, light system and security system. Fully Air Conditioned 3 Reading Halls (24x7) and 3 Reading Halls with stack area, Computer Lab, Periodical Section and Thesis Section for Ph.D. Scholars. All the reading areas of the Library are spacious, peaceful and well furnished with comfortable furniture. The Library is having rich collection of publications which include books, journals, thesis/dissertations, reports, newspapers and magazines etc.

The Library at present has a total collection of 1,14,398 books, 13000+ e-Journals are available through ONOS (One Nation One Subscription), 562 Thesis and 425 Dissertation, 579 e-books, 550 books in regional languages, 600 books for competitive examination, 150 books for differently-abled students, 406 old question paper set in paper bank, 7 Magazines, 1 Discovery Science Magazine and 14 newspapers to cater to the needs of the users. The Library also provides Reference Books (2287) including Encyclopaedia, Dictionary etc. The SC/ST Book Bank with collection of 2837 books exists in the library for SC/ST students of various departments. The facility of online Journals and database is being provided to the users by INFLIBNET through UGC Infonet Digital Library Consortium Shodh Sindhu and ONOS (One Nation One Subscription). e-books, e-journals, e-newspapers and Inter Library Loan facility is also available through DELNET. The Wi-Fi internet connectivity is available in the Library for easy access of internet services. Further, there is an access to E-books within University campus. The library is fully automated and well equipped.

International Relations and Foreign Affairs

In keeping with its commitment to global academic engagement, the university has instituted the Office of International Relations and Foreign Affairs, as a dedicated administrative body to manage and facilitate international academic partnerships.

The Dean IR/FA serves as the nodal officer for all matters concerning foreign students seeking admission at CDLU. Applications from prospective international students are routed through the Dean, International Relations and Foreign Affairs, and foreign students may contact the Dean IR/FA at any time during the academic year for admission-related guidance.

The office works in coordination with departmental chairpersons to process admissions of international applicants. The office liaises with the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) for matters concerning equivalence of degrees obtained from foreign institutions.

In all programmes, seats may be filled as supernumerary seats reserved for foreign nationals, and the Dean IR/FA oversees the implementation of these provisions. The office thus functions as the primary bridge between CDLU and the international academic community, ensuring that global

scholars receive appropriate institutional support throughout their stay and studies at the university. The university has several international MoUs which help the academics and research at CDLU in a positive way.

CONSTRUCTION BRANCH

The Construction Wing has taken in hand various construction projects since inception of the University i.e. Boys Hostel No.2, Girls Hostel No.2, Vice Chancellor's Residence & Camp Office, Faculty House, various type of well-furnished residences of H, Super-H, C, Super-C, D, E, E-2 and F Type houses for university officers/employees, Day Care Centre, Water Treatment Plant, Over Head Service Reservoir, University Boundary Wall, Water Supply and Sewage Scheme, Sewage Treatment Plant, Teaching Blocks No. II, III & IV, Media Centre, Library Building, Shopping complex, Main Gate at Dabwali Road, Internal Roads (Phase-II) & several parking, Multipurpose Hall (open Auditorium, main hall with seating capacity of 1500 and Indoor Auditorium with seating capacity of 450 seat). The work of Administrative Block, Air Conditioning Plant at MP Hall & Sound Reinforcement System at MP Hall, 11 KV Indoor Electric main Sub Station & Compact Sub Station, Building for Electric Sub Station, High Mast Lighting, LED Street Lights, Conventional Light Fitting, Laying of Sports Flooring at MP Hall, Construction of Water Storage Tank and Providing Sprinkler System in various lawns, Solar Power Plant, Solar Water Heating System, Girls Hostel No.3, Herbal Park, Information Centre & Guidance Bureau, Connecting Roads to all buildings, Seminar Hall & Class Room and Extension of Boys Hostel No.1 completed. The Statute of Chaudhary Devi Lal Ji, Former Deputy Prime Minister of India, Beautification and Renovation of Rotary in front of Main Gate and other miscellaneous development works completed in recent years. The works i.e. Renovation of Faculty House, 06 Nos. Car & 02 Nos. Bus Garage of Service Station, Boundary Wall of University Disputed Land and Shifting of Main Gate of Girls Hostel have been completed. Besides various Shops and Cafeteria, Branch of Punjab National Bank with ATM facility and Health Centre is being run in the building of Shopping Complex. Silent Generator Sets are also available in the University to meet out the requirement of power during power failure. Recently, the construction projects i.e. Construction of building for U.I.T.D.C., Teaching Block No.-5 and Student Activity Centre have been completed in time. Construction of Path (IPB) from Boys Hostel No.- I to Boys Hostel No. - II completed to facilitate the Students/residents.

The fresh proposals i.e. Construction of Teaching Block No.6, Construction of Girls Hostel No.4, Construction of Water Storage Tank, Development of University Campus (New roads, roundabout etc.) and Solar Power Plant are in pipeline.

Hostels

At Present, there are five hostels-three for girls and two for boys, namely, Harki Devi Bhawan (Girls' Hostel-I), Kalpana Chawla Bhawan (Girls' Hostel-II), Savitri Bai Phulle Bhawan (Girls' Hostel-III), Lala Lajpat Rai Bhawan (Boys' Hostel-I) and Sardar Patel Bhawan (Boys' Hostel-II with extension). All the five hostels have been provided with tube/LED lights and ceiling fans in every room. Solar panels are also installed at roof top of all these hostels. Electric geysers have been installed in bathrooms. Water coolers with RO system have also been provided. The hostels subscribe several national and regional magazines and newspapers for enabling the students to know what is happening around the world. The facility of LED has been provided in common rooms of all the hostels. Full A.C. reading hall is available for all girls in Girls Hostel-III and for boys in Boys Hostel-II. Medical facilities to all hostel residents are provided through the university Health Centre located in University premises. Washing machine facility is also available in all the hostels. Besides, one ANM and Ambulance facility has also been provided for the girl residents.

The Chief Warden, along with all Wardens, makes every possible effort to see that the students get a cleaner surrounding within and outside the hostel premises, get hygienic food and always respond to the complaints of hostel residents in a positive manner. A total number of 38 benches (Three-seater each) have been provided in the premises of Girl's and Boy's Hostels separately. In the premises of both Girls Hostels, two separate lawns have been developed and Badminton Courts has also been constructed in four hostels. In Girl's Hostels, the facility of Table Tennis &

Badminton and in Boy's Hostels, the facility of Table Tennis, Badminton and Volleyball has also been provided. The Gymnasium facility has been provided in the Hostels. E-rickshaw facility has also been provided for the residents of the hostels.

UNIVERSITY IT, DATA & COMPUTER CENTRE (UITDC)

IT Facilities and Infrastructure:

1. Internet Connectivity (Lease Lines)

The University has procured the following two (02) different dedicated Internet Lease Lines for uninterrupted and 24 x 7 Internet access for its stakeholders:

- i) Dedicated Lease Line (1:1) provided by National Knowledge Network (NKN) with **1 Gbps** bandwidth since 2011.
- ii) Dedicated Lease Line (1:1) procured by the University with **700 Mbps** bandwidth from Railtel Corporation of India for 3 years.

2. Networking

UITDC has established a University-wide Local Area Network (LAN) and W-LAN/Wi-Fi for providing internet facilities to all stakeholders. An optical Fiber-based LAN setup has approximately 400 nodes. Wi-Fi connectivity is available 24x7 in all buildings with required number of Access Points.

The University has Data Centre/Server Room with high-end and latest configuration servers with uninterrupted power supply for various IT projects like the Examination System, Online Admissions, University Website, Digital Library etc.

UITDC prefers the latest and next-generation IT tools and gadgets such as firewalls, L-3/L-2 switches, managed switches, routers, bridges, log servers, etc., for upgrading the existing IT infrastructure.

3. Internet Access

The university is currently using the firewalls by procuring Hardware-based Next-Generation Firewalls to provide a safe, secure, and restricted internet browsing environment. UITDC is providing two-tier authentication to all internet users of the University to avoid unauthorized access and misuse of the internet. Each internet user has a unique user ID and password for using internet services in the campus of the University.

4. Webmail Services

University has subscribed to Google Workspace for Education Fundamentals for facilitating its stakeholders for smooth functioning of teaching-learning processes, online meetings, webmail services for official correspondence, and free data storage/cloud service to store important files, documents, etc.

6. **University Computer Centre:** Two Computer Labs (UCC) having 59 Nos. of desktop computers with LAN & Wi-Fi connectivity, adequate furniture and sufficient power backup, have been established on the 2nd floor of Vivekananda Library to facilitate the students, research scholars, and staff members (teaching & non-teaching) as per their requirements. In addition to above, three (3) Computer Labs having 94 Nos. of desktop computers with LAN & Wi-Fi connectivity, adequate furniture and sufficient power backup have been established recently in the Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Bhawan, CDLU, Sirsa.
7. **University Website:** The University Website (www.cdlu.ac.in) is being maintained and updated efficiently, effectively and promptly by the University Website Office. Being very descriptive and informative, the number of global visitors on the University website is increasing day by day. Further, this office has initiated the process of strengthening the website accessibility.
8. **Online Admission:** The process of admission under various Programmes run by the University Teaching Departments (UTDs) and USGS is being done through the online web portal.

Results Branch

The Results Branch of Chaudhary Devi Lal University has been functioning efficiently since the establishment of the University in 2003. Over the years, the University has produced a large number of graduates/postgraduates who are contributing significantly in diverse professional fields across India and abroad, thereby enhancing the reputation of the institution at national and international levels.

The Results Branch is one of the most important administrative units of the Examination Wing and functions under the direct control and supervision of the Controller of Examinations. The Branch plays a pivotal role in ensuring transparent, accurate, efficient and timely conduct of all result-related activities for the University and its affiliated institutions.

At present, the entire result processing system, including both pre-examination and post-examination activities, has been successfully transformed into a digital and automated platform. The University has adopted advanced information technology systems for the preparation, verification, processing and publication of examination results. Admit cards are issued electronically and all examination results are processed digitally in-house, ensuring greater transparency, accuracy, confidentiality and speedy delivery of services.

Every year, the Results Branch caters to innumerable students enrolled in various affiliated Degree Colleges, Engineering Colleges, Management Institutes, Education Colleges and University Teaching Departments. The Branch handles a wide range of responsibilities, including:

- Processing and declaration of examination results;
- Preparation and issuance of Detailed Marks Certificates (DMCs);
- Issuance of Degrees and Provisional Certificates;
- Maintenance of academic records and student result databases;
- Handling of re-evaluation, rechecking and result correction cases;
- Online verification of academic credentials;
- Student facilitation and grievance redressal related to examination results.

The foremost objective of the Results Branch is to ensure the timely declaration of results and prompt issuance of DMCs and Degrees while maintaining the highest standards of accuracy, confidentiality and administrative efficiency.

To enhance student convenience and promote digital governance, the University has implemented an online student service system through which students are provided individual login IDs and passwords. Through this portal, students can access their examination forms, admit cards, results, DMCs, academic records and other examination-related services anytime and from anywhere.

In line with the digital initiatives of the University Grants Commission and the Government of India, the University has also implemented the National Academic Depository (NAD)/DigiLocker system for secure digital storage and verification of Degrees, DMCs and other academic documents. This initiative enables students to access and share authenticated academic credentials digitally at any time, thereby reducing dependency on physical documents and promoting paperless administration.

In accordance with the transformative vision of the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020), the University has undertaken several significant reforms in its examination and academic systems. The Results Branch is actively supporting the implementation of NEP-2020 by integrating student-centric, flexible, multidisciplinary and technology-driven practices into the examination and result management processes.

As part of NEP implementation, the University has adopted the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) Scheme introduced by UGC. Under this system, students can digitally store, transfer and redeem academic credits earned from different recognized institutions, thereby facilitating multiple entry and exit options, interdisciplinary learning and academic mobility. The ABC framework empowers students to continue their education flexibly and utilize earned credits for future academic progression.

With continuous modernization, adoption of emerging technologies and commitment to quality service delivery, the Results Branch of the University remains dedicated to providing efficient, transparent and student-friendly examination services while contributing actively toward the successful implementation of NEP-2020 and the overall academic excellence of the University.

SC/ST Cell and SC/ST Computer Lab

The SC/ST Cell has been established as per UGC guidelines to facilitate the SC/ST students of the University and to ensure proper implementation of various schemes as per the instructions of UGC/State Govt. from time to time. It is located in Vivekananda Library at 2nd floor. SC/ST Cell functions as grievances Redressal Cell for the grievances of SC/ST Students and Employees of the University and renders them necessary help in solving their academic as well as administrative grievances. A link is also available on University Website to file any complaint by SC Students to get redress their grievances. A computer lab having 14 computers and 22 laptops has also been set up for the use of SC/ST students and functions from Monday to Saturday. To get redress the grievance of SC Students and employees an Internal Grievance Redressal Committee (IGRC) has been constituted by the Vice-Chancellor.

Dr. Sanjeet Kumar, Professor, Department of Business Administration has been assigned the charge of Liaison Officer (SC/ST Cell). The additional charge of SC/ST Cell has been assigned to Sh. R.C. Moury, Superintendent.

It also carries out any other work assigned to it from time to time so as to promote higher education among these community suffering from economics, social and educational deprivations.

Welfare Schemes for SC/BC Students

The University ensures proper implementation of various schemes of the UGC/Government of India/State Government concerning admission, scholarship etc. for the welfare of the students of reserved categories. The guidelines as revised from time to time by the Central and State Governments are displayed on the Notice Boards, prominent places and in the University prospectus for the benefit of the students belonging to SC/BC category. The guidelines are strictly adhered to. Apart from Post-Matric Scholarship for SC/BC students, the State Merit Scholarship for students with Physical Disabilities are also offered.

Career Counselling, Internship & Industry Cell

A Career Counseling, Internship & Industry Cell has been established in the University to address the diverse socio-economic handicaps, linguistic differences and geographic backgrounds of the heterogeneous population of students coming to the University vis-à-vis equity of access and placement opportunities through availability of appropriate institutional support information. The Career Counseling, Internship & Industry Cell also helps the students by providing appropriate guidance to establish linkages with the world of work and locate career opportunities. This cell is actively involved in carrying out vocational guidance and campus based interviews. The following are the major objectives of the cell:

- To gather information on job avenues and placements in different institutions and concerns related to the Programme(s) offered by this University.
- To analyze information in the local, regional and national contexts to explore its relevance and utility for the students in their placements and on job-training.
- To organize Seminars and Guidance Workshops for informing the students about the emerging Professional Trends and Events, job profiles, leadership roles, entrepreneurship, market needs and risks and implementation of national socio-economic policies and to impart training in soft skills.
- To promote discipline, healthy outlook and positive attitudes for strengthening National Integration and removal of narrow provincial preferences and prejudice.

University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC)

University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC) has been inaugurated by Hon'ble Governor of Haryana on May 27, 2023 in CV Raman Bhawan (Science Block) of the University. It works as Central Instrumentation Lab with some necessary sophisticated analytical instruments of scientific importance within the reach of the faculty members as well as research scholars for research activities. At present, X-ray diffractometer (XRD), Fourier Transform Infrared Spectrometer (FTIR), Differential Scanning Calorimeter (DSC), High Performance Liquid Chromatograph (HPLC) and Gas Chromatograph (GC) and Texture Analyzer (TA), are main instruments which are available and functional in the university. This facility helps a lot in carrying out quality research work in the university.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The University has constituted the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) to instil the momentum of quality consciousness and continuous assessment and improvement. The cell works to develop a quality system of conscious, consistent and catalytically Programmed action for improving the academic and administrative performance of the HEIs and to promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and

institutionalization of best practices. The IQAC achieved the above said goals by offering itself the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) for inspection. Grade from NAAC is considered Hall Mark of the quality of any HEI. The University has been accredited with Grade “B” valid for a period of five years.

Office of Dean Students’ Welfare

This office is actively organizes/arranges the following:

- (i) Issuance of Bus Passes
- (ii) Awareness Campaign on HIV/AIDS.
- (iii) Health Awareness/Checkup Camp.
- (iv) Educational and Industrial Tours to different places
- (v) Fee Concession through Student Aid Fund
- (vi) Helps the University Teaching Departments students to participate in Inter-College tournaments and Inter University tournaments in various games.
- (vii) Assists in procurement of Yearly Group Insurance Scheme of regular students of the University Teaching Departments.
- (viii) Organizes the Annual International Yoga Day on 21st June.
- (ix) Arranges Students’ Induction Programme/ Orientation Programme.
- (x) Organizes Annual Athletic Meet.
- (xi) The facilities of E-Riksha for students etc.

Directorate of Youth Welfare

It's impressive to see the comprehensive approach taken by the Directorate of Youth Welfare Department at Chaudhary Devi Lal University towards nurturing cultural awareness and promoting values among students. Cultural activities play a significant role in not just preserving our heritage but also in instilling positive values and fostering a sense of patriotism among students. Organizing events like the Talent Hunt Competition and the University Youth Festival not only identify and encourage students' talents but also provide them with a platform to showcase their skills in various cultural domains.

Winning prizes at national-level youth festivals is a testament to the dedication and talent of the students and reflects the commitment of the university towards their overall development.

By organizing such events and initiatives, the Directorate of Youth Welfare Department is not just contributing to the cultural enrichment of the university but also nurturing well-rounded individuals who are equipped with the skills, values, and mindset to contribute positively to society. It's commendable to see such efforts towards holistic student development.

Sports Council

Sports activities of the University are being run under the Sports Council. The University has following playfields: Handball (1), Football (1), Volleyball (2), Netball (1), Korfball (1), Kho-Kho (1), Kabaddi (1), Wrestling (1), Basketball (2), Judo (1), Athletics Track & Multipurpose Hall for indoor sports activities and Gym (female & male).

The University is providing following Sports facilities:

- TA/DA during Inter University Tournaments.
- Free Sports Kit and Track Suits to the players participating in Inter University Tournaments.

University Health Centre

The University Health Centre located in the Shopping Complex on the 1st floor from room no. 101-104. It has sufficient place for OPD, dispensary and inward. It has facility of consultation, medicines & laboratory tests, treatment at free of cost. There is an Ambulance to carry the sick students to referral hospitals. The Health Centre provides its services during games, physical efficiency tests and functions organized by university. The students, the employees of the university and their dependents are availing the medical facilities being provided by the University Health Centre.

Youth Red Cross

Youth are the pillars and future leaders of the country. Today's youth is tomorrow's India. The Youth Red Cross, the youngest wing of Indian Red Cross Society, Haryana State Branch is active at the University Level. A Youth Red Cross Unit is working in the University Campus for this purpose. A fifteen member YRC Committee of CDLU, Sirsa has been constituted under the chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor to promote the YRC activities in all the colleges/institutions within the jurisdiction of the university. Meeting of Executive Committee at University Level and of students volunteers are called from time to time to decide about the YRC future plans.

Research & Development Cell

University has a functioning office of Dean Research which acts as a pivot entity to streamline and coordinate research related activities. Of lately, the office of Dean Research has been restructured keeping in line with University Grants Commission circulars in this regard. Accordingly, a Research & Development Cell has been established in the University which comprises six different bodies. The Cell is guided by its apex body namely Research Advisory Council which lays down the goals of the Cell. Five other committees namely Finance and Infrastructure Committee, Research Programme and Policy Development Committee, Collaboration and Community Committee, Product Development and Commercialization Committee, and IPR, Legal and Ethical Matters Committees have also been constituted to achieve the goals set by the Advisory Council. Cell is headed by the Dean Research and coordinated by Coordinator, R&D Cell.

RTI Cell

The RTI Cell deals with RTI applications and RTI appeals on behalf of the University under the provision of the RTI Act and provides information to the information seekers.

Anti-Ragging

1. (i) Zero Tolerance on Ragging

- Ragging in the University Campus is totally banned.
- Any student found indulging in the act of ragging shall be liable to disciplinary action as per the University rules.
- Anyone who witnesses a ragging incident or being ragged on the campus can submit her/his complaint immediately to Nodal officer (Anti-Ragging Complaints) on Email ID: antiragging@cdlu.ac.in.

- (ii) Hon'ble Supreme Court of India with regard to curbing of ragging in Educational Institutions clearly mandates that:

“If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty/chance to explain which if found unsatisfactory, shall be expelled from the institution, as orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India”.

Instructions for curbing ragging: Ragging in educational institutions is banned and anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately, which may include suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period, expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period or fine as per UGC guidelines up to Rs. 2.50 lacs. The punishment may also take the shape of (i) withholding scholarships or other benefits, (ii) debarring from representation in events, (iii) withholding results, (iv) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess. If the individuals, committing or abetting ragging, are not/ cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

The following will be termed as the act of ragging: Any disorderly conduct whether spoken or written or by an act, which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student(s), indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in fresher or junior student(s) or asking the student(s) to do any act or perform something, which such student(s) will not do in the ordinary Programme and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher student.

2. Smoking/ drinking/ possession or consumption of prohibited drugs is strictly prohibited on the Campus and is considered as an offence. If any student is found indulging in such activities, strict action will be taken against them. If anyone is found violating this rule, the same may be brought to the notice of any of the following: -
 - a. Registrar
 - b. Nodal officer (Anti-Ragging Complaints)
 - c. Dean Students' Welfare
 - d. Chief Warden (Boys & Girls)
 - e. Anti-Ragging Squad (Male & Female)
3. It is mandatory that anti-ragging measures taken by the University should be brought to the notice of Principals/Directors of Affiliated Colleges/Institutes to take similar actions in respect of their Colleges/Institutes, The Dean of Colleges will issue instructions to the Principals/Directors of affiliated Colleges/Institutes especially to Technical Institutions to ensure that no untoward incident occurs in their College/Institution. The Institution failing to curb ragging or fail to follow. The UGC regulations & "The Haryana Prohibitions of Ragging in Educational Institution Ordinance, 2012" in letter and spirit will be dealt severely and stern action, to the extent of disaffiliation of the concerned institution, will be taken.
4. Nodal Officer (Anti-Ragging Complaints) may be authorized to facilitate safety & security apps without affecting the privacy of individual students with regard to create the avenues to spread the idea of ragging free campus (Ref. UGC letter No. 1-15/2009 (ARC) Pt.III dt. 28 may 2018).
5. As per UGC letter No. 1-15/2009(ARC) Pt.III dt.25.05.2023, the revised procedure for students to file online Anti-Ragging Affidavit is as under:
 - (i) The students will fill an online Anti-ragging affidavit on designated website i.e. www.antiragging.in. On the website of the University (www.cdlu.ac.in), there is a link “Anti-Ragging Undertaking” under Students Corner. While opening the link, the Undertaking

Registration form for universities will open and students and their parents will fill the same. Further any UGC regulations received from time to time will also be applicable.

- (ii) After filling the said affidavit, he/she will receive an email with his/her registration/reference no.
- (iii) The student will forward that email to his/her Chairperson/Director/Principal's Email ID.
- (iv) The Chairpersons/ Directors/Principals of University Teaching Departments/Institutes will ensure the following:
 - A. To issue the temporary ID cards to fresh admitted students if the permanent ID cards have not been issued by the University.
 - B. The student will fill an online Anti-Ragging Undertaking on the designated website www.antiragging.in.
 - C. They will submit the consolidated data in prescribed format in excel sheet by 31 October of each year to the office of the Nodal Officer (Anti-Ragging Complaints) through email in soft copy only at email id antiragging@cdlu.ac.in

Anti Eve-teasing Committee

EVE-teasing is a criminal offence. Making unwanted gestures towards girls or passing offensive comments are not only immoral acts but also subject to penal action under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). Boys student are advised not to indulge in such acts. University has an Anti-Eve teasing Committee headed by the Vice-Chancellor. The Committee comprises Dean Academic Affairs, Proctor, Chief Warden, Dean Students Welfare, Dean of Colleges, Controller of Examinations, Lady Warden, SDM Sirsa, City Magistrate, Sirsa, DSP (HQ), Sirsa, SHO (City), Sirsa besides some student representatives and important citizens are also its members.

Women Complaints Committee

Women Complaints Committee for women employees and girls against sexual harassment was constituted as per University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions) Regulations, 2015.

AISHE Cell

As per directions of UGC & Ministry of Education, an online survey is conducted by HEI's on Higher Education with regards to Students details, Infrastructure, Results, Admissions, Scholarships, Fellowship, Research activities etc., every year. This University and its 62 affiliated Colleges including University College are conducting the survey accordingly so that the data of HEI's may be helpful to the Govt. for future planning/policy of higher education etc. The AISHE unit is working under the guidance of State AISHE unit under the Directorate of Higher Education, Haryana Panchkula. It also provides online / offline training / workshop to the Nodal Officers of all affiliated

Colleges from time to time.

NEP-2020 Cell

Admissions in Undergraduate Programmes (except NCTE, AICTE and BCI etc.) as per NEP-2020 were started in the Academic Session 2021-22 in the University School for Graduate Studies (USGS). Each Programme comprises of different type of Programmes i.e. Discipline Specific Programmes (DSC), Minor Programmes (MIC), Multidisciplinary Programmes (MDC), Ability Enhancement Programmes (AEC), Skill Enhancement Programmes (SEC), Value Added Programmes (VAC), Internship, and Dissertation/ Research Project. Multiple entry and multiple exit options are being offered to students. There is a flexibility for students in choosing the programmes. Related information is available on University Website (<https://www.cdlu.ac.in>).

National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a noble experiment in academic expansion. It inculcates the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers through sustained community interactions. It brings out academic institutions closer to society. It shows how to combine knowledge and action to achieve results, which are desirable for community development. National Service Scheme at this University has been established with the objective of providing students with an opportunity to develop their overall personality by taking part in various Social Service Schemes.

An NSS committee at university level was constituted under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor. There are 38 units of NSS in the university, three of University Teaching Departments and others in various affiliated colleges of Sirsa and Fatehabad Districts. There are 18 units of SFS also in affiliating colleges in addition of 38 units.

Ombudsperson

The objective of the Ombudsperson is to provide opportunities for Redressal of certain grievances of students already enrolled in any institution, as well as those seeking admission to such institutions, and a mechanism thereto.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

National Cadet Corps (NCC) has been functioning in our university since the session 2022–23 under 3 Haryana Girls Battalion NCC, Hisar. The battalion allots 50 open vacancies for girls. The National Cadet Corps (NCC) plays a vital role in shaping the personality and character of students in educational institutions. It promotes discipline, leadership, teamwork, and a sense of patriotism among cadets. Through regular training, drills, and camps, NCC helps students develop physical fitness, mental resilience, and practical skills like first aid, weapon handling, and disaster management.

Career Advantage: NCC cadets gain a distinct edge in careers, especially in the armed forces, where they may receive special entry schemes and bonus marks. - (iv) Parivar Pehchan patra (PPP) shall remain mandatory for Haryana Students for taking admissions. Also, the caste/reservation/financial benefits given to the candidate shall be on the basis of verified caste/income fetched through PPP. Any unverified data of PPP of the candidate shall lead to his candidature considered in General Category only.
- (v) In case, the name appears in the merit list, the candidate has to visit the concerned department/ College within stipulated time for verification of documents along with original documents and one set of photocopies (self-attested). Fee will be deposited after verification of documents.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE AND GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- I. Candidates will have to apply for admission in ONLINE mode only and they are advised to read the HBI thoroughly before filling up the Online Application Form.
- II. Opportunity for admission in PG programmes running in UTD's/ Affiliated Colleges of the University session 2026-27 shall be provided/given to candidates having re-appear/compartment in qualifying examination only when the waiting list of clear pass eligible candidates is exhausted. The same is also applicable in case of admission on the basis of first come-first serve.
- III. Admission may be allowed against vacant seats (after physical counseling) in PG programmes to candidates having re-appear in one paper of any semester at UG level, subject to the condition that he/she will submit his/her complete result of qualifying examination (with required percentage of marks as per eligibility of the programme) before the commencement of the classes of 3rd semester of the concerned PG programme, otherwise, his/her provisional admission will be cancelled ab initio.
- IV. "Non-submission of Internal Assessment/Practical Award within 10 days after the start of Examination/Conduct of practical examinations and any rectification after submission of the Internal Assessment/Practical Award will not be considered in any case except with a prescribed fine per student per subject as notified time to time by the University. However, Vice-Chancellor may exempt the above provision in special case.
- V. Admissions will be subject to fulfillment of the minimum eligibility conditions. University Ordinances may be kept in view while making admissions.
- VI. **Warning:- Cheating and forgery are criminal offences punishable under Indian Penal Code. Hence, candidates must observe integrity while filling up admission form and uploading documents.**
- VII. **Necessary certificates/documents/testimonials will be required at the time of admission.** Application form along with photocopies of the certificates/testimonials/ documents **duly self-certified** should be submitted by the candidates in the concerned department.
- VIII. In case of any exigency, the University follows the guidelines issued by the Govt. of Haryana. Students seeking admission will also have to abide by them.
- IX. **If a student gets admission in second PG programme he/she has to submit the No Dues Certificate from the concerned Department and Accounts Branch.**
- X. Application fee once paid will not be refunded.
 1. No admission shall be allowed after **September 30, 2026**. However, it may be changed by the Vice Chancellor if required.
 2. The constitution of the admission committee is as under:

i) Chairperson of the Department	– Convener
ii) Two teachers (Regular /APC/PTT)*	– Member
iii) One teacher representative of SC/DSC category	– Member
iv) One teacher representative of Female category	–Member

***Note:** The Chairpersons shall include regular teachers followed by APC & PTT in the Admission Committee. Minimum three members shall form the quorum. Out of them, One SC/DSC and one female teacher is mandatory in the Admission Committee.
 3. All the admissions shall be provisional till their registration in the University is finalized.
 4. Preference will be given to the GATE qualified (valid) for admission to M.Tech. CSE (2.5 year).

5. To start a Programme, the requirement of minimum number of applications will be 25% of the sanctioned seats in regular programmes and 50% of the sanctioned seats in self-financing programmes. Further, the Chairperson/Principal of concerned Department/College will ensure the financial viability before starting the Self- Financing Programme. In case the number of students admitted remains less than 10 in number in a particular programme, the classes for that Programme will not be started.
6. The University shall take decision with regard to continuity/modification/closure of the Course/Programme introduced on the basis of the assessment carried out every year. However, no Course/Programme will be called off or closed midway once the students have been admitted to the course on the grounds of inadequate enrolment and the resultant lack of financial viability during a particular year. The decision regarding the closure of the said Course/Programme will be taken in advance, latest by closing of the academic session by the concerned Staff Council. However, to make the Programme financially viable, fee can be increased in any semester.
7. Though a candidate can apply for admission in more than one Programme, no student shall be permitted to be on the rolls of two departments of the University or two Programmes as regular student in the same Department or two educational institutions, simultaneously.
8. (i) There shall be no age limit for those who apply for admission in any Postgraduate programme in the University Teaching Departments for the first time.
 (ii) The students who have passed one regular Postgraduate examination from campus of this University shall not be allowed to take admission to another Post Graduate Programme as a regular student after 32 years of age. However, he/she can seek admission in the professional programmes like MBA, LLB, Ph.D programme etc. Five years age relaxation will be given to the candidates belonging to the categories i.e. Female/SC/DSC/ST/BC/DAP/EWS/Benchmark Disability. This relaxation in age will be given to the candidates seeking admission in the Postgraduate languages Programme i.e. Hindi, English, Sanskrit and Punjabi.
 (iii) The age of the candidate will be considered on the last date of submission of application for admission in the University.
9. Candidates who, after passing one stage of education are studying in the same stage of education in a different subject e.g. Intermediate Science after Intermediate Arts or B.Com. after B. A. or M.A. in one subject after M.A in other subjects will not be eligible for Post Matric scholarship.
10. System/formula for admission:
 - (a) The candidates who come from other Universities/Institutions where percentage of marks is awarded along with CGPA, the percentage of marks as awarded by the concerned University will be considered and no further conversion is required.
 - (b) In case of other institutions or Universities where no equivalent percentage of marks is expressly provided, but the conversion formula of the CPGA awarded has been given by the concerned University/Board, the percentage of marks would be obtained by using the conversion formula of that University.
 - (c) In case of other Institutions or Universities where no equivalent percentage of marks is given or no formula for conversion of the CGPA is expressly provided, the percentage of marks will be calculated on the basis of the following formula made evident from following examples:
 - i) If a candidate gets 4 on a scale of 5, his percentage of Marks would be : $4/5 \times 100 = 80\%$
 - ii) If a candidate gets on CGPA of 7 on a scale of 10, his Percentage of marks will be : $7/10 \times 100 = 70\%$
 - iii) If a candidate gets 3 on a scale of 10, his Percentage of marks will be : $7/10 \times 100 = 70\%$

11. Candidates who have got compartment in the qualifying examination shall not be allowed admission to any Post-Graduate Programme in normal admission process i.e. before Physical Counselling.
12. Five percent relaxation (5 out of 100) in minimum eligibility condition for admission to various Programmes except LLB and M.PE.d. will be given to the candidates who are blind or are Differently Abled.
13. Unless otherwise specifically provided for a course in the concerned Ordinance, the eligibility condition for SC/ST/DSC candidates will be minimum pass marks in the qualifying examinations for admission to various Courses/Programmes. As conveyed by General Administration Department, General Services – III Branch, Govt. of Haryana vide their circular No. 22/129/2013 – 1GSIII dated 16-07-2014 (Annexure-III).
14. There will be no rounding of percentage for determining the eligibility for admission to various courses. Merit will be calculated upto two digits i.e. 67.77.
15. Candidate having B. Voc. Degree will be considered eligible for transdisciplinary vertical mobility into such Courses/Programmes where entry qualification is a Bachelor degree without specific requirement in a particular discipline.
16. In case two or more candidates have equal percentage of marks in the merit list, their marks of the next lower examination will be considered. If again the score is equal, the candidate senior in age shall be considered first in the merit list. There shall be no rounding up percentage of marks from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility and merit for admission to various programmes. In case two candidates have the same merit score, the scores in the lower examinations will be considered.
17. The candidates shall update or submit their result/revised result of the qualifying examination at any time during the process of admission. In case the candidate cannot upload any document, he/she may send the same to the official email of the department or send it by post but the documents must reach the concerned department atleast one day before the counseling date. Their candidature will be considered for admission in subsequent provisional admission lists.
18. The confidential result of the qualifying examinations or the duly verified result published on the official website of the concerned University/Board shall be treated as the proof of having passed the qualifying examination in case the DMC has not been issued. In such cases, the candidate has to produce a certificate from the Principal/HOD/University concerned also showing the maximum marks of the qualifying degree. However, the candidate shall have to produce the original DMC/Degree for the purpose of admission within a month from the date of dispatch by the concerned University/Board otherwise his/her case of registration will not be considered (to be sent through email or by post).
19. The Chairpersons of UTDs/Principals of the affiliated colleges are permitted to admit the students after a gap of studies, if the student is otherwise, eligible and his/her case falls under the admission policy. Gap year(s) affidavit shall be uploaded at the time of admission.
20. The provisional admission lists in descending order of merit will be displayed on the University Website or Portal as per the given schedule. No separate intimation for counseling will be sent to the candidates. For any change or revision in the schedule or vacancy of seats, the students are desired to visit the website frequently.
21. The students will have to upload documents at the time of admission along with application form except the migration certificate, which can be submitted for the purpose of Registration as per the schedule given in HBI in the Chapter- Registration
 - (a) At the time of admission, every candidate shall be required to give an undertaking of good behavior as character certificate (**Annexure-IV**). If a candidate, after his/her admission to any programme in the University Teaching Department, is found to be indulging in any kind of ragging or any act of indiscipline, his/her admission is liable to be cancelled.

- (b) The parents/guardian of the candidate will have to sign an undertaking to this effect to be sent through email to the concerned department. If a candidate is found to have been involved in such an act, his/her admission shall be cancelled, besides a penal action under the law will be taken against such student(s). The candidate and his/her parent/guardian shall sign an undertaking to this effect on the proforma given in HBI (**Annexure-V**).
22. Character Certificate is essential. The candidates will upload it at the time of admission.
- A. Private Candidates:**
Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidates should submit their character certificate duly signed by a First Class Magistrate/Public Notary/Gazetted Officer/MC of the concerned area/Sarpanch of concerned Village.
- B. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination as regular students:**
Such candidates must submit the Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
23. If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character, past behavior and antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to any programme in order to ensure and maintain the academic standard, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the University. The Vice-Chancellor may also cancel the admission of any student for a specific period on the specific complaint/report of Proctor/Chairperson.
24. The Admission Committee can demand to see the original certificates at any time. During the counseling period, the candidates are advised to remain alert for any message from the department in this regard.
25. The students enrolled in programmes other than weekend and evening programmes shall submit an undertaking to the effect that they are neither doing nor will they do any kind of job during the period of their study.
26. All certificates/undertakings/self-certifications to be submitted by the candidates should be strictly according to the format given in this Hand Book of Information.
27. Reservation of seats shall be as per rules mentioned in the Handbook of Information.
28. The maternity leave will be granted to the students (UTDs and affiliated colleges) upto three months and attendance may be counted excluding this period in all Courses except the Courses in Law Department (where BCI rules are implemented) and the courses being run in the Department of Physical Education.
29. It may be ensured that the children of single parent are not denied admission on the plea that names of both the parents are not mentioned in the certificate of qualifying examination/admission form, if they are otherwise eligible/ subject to fulfillment of all other conditions of admission.
30. Admission Committee in case of doubt regarding the recognition of lower qualifying examination passed by the candidate from other University/Board and his/her percentage of marks in the qualifying examinations, prior clarification must be sought from the Deputy Registrar (Academic) of this University before allowing provisional admission. An updated photocopy of Book of Equivalence of (Indian/Foreign) Examination of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra is available in the Academic Branch, CDLU, Sirsa. Book of Equivalence of (Indian/Foreign) Examination of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra will be followed.
31. Admission Committee will be responsible for the admission and check the eligibility of the candidates.
32. ITI passed out candidates will be considered for admission as per letter no. Memo no. **18/23/2020 UNP (4) dated 19.02.2020 (Annexure-VI)**
33. This University will follow the rules regarding admissions under Sports Quota in the Programmes running in the UTD's as per the Instructions Guidelines issued by the Association of Indian University.
- (xvi) The affiliated Colleges of the University shall follow the rules regarding admissions under Sports

Quota as per the Instruction/ Guidelines issued by the State Govt.

- (xvii) Two additional supernumerary seats in the PG programmes and five additional seats in TDS (UG Programmes) as over and above the sanctioned seats will be allowed to the outstanding sports persons in each program. However, the candidate shall be required to submit the grading certificate to that effect from the Director of Sports of the concerned State. The District Sports Officer/Head of the Institution shall countersign these certificates. The certificates issued by the State University of Haryana will be verified by the Secretary, Sports Council of their respective University, hence they do not need gradation certificate. This University will follow the Instructions and Guidelines of the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra (**Annexure-VII**) regarding admissions under Sports Quota except point no. (viii), which is substituted by the provision that in case of admission in the University Teaching Departments the following committee shall resolve the dispute, if any.

- i) Dean of Concerned Faculty
- ii) Dean Faculty of Education/Chairperson, Department of Physical Education
- iii) Chairperson of the department concerned

In case of admissions in the Affiliated Colleges, the Principal of the concerned college will be competent authority to resolve the dispute in admissions under Sports Quota.

- (xviii) **After completion of Physical Efficiency Test (PET), the Observer will submit the list of PET qualified candidates to the Principal of the concerned College/Chairperson, Department of Physical Education/ Dean USGS to forward the same to Director, UITDC for necessary action at admissionhelpdesk@cdu.ac.in .**

- (xix) If any student is found indulged in causing any loss to life, property or staff of the University, he/she will be prosecuted as per Proctorial Rules.

- (xx) The Department/College will verify the percentage, weightages and reservation category based on documents uploaded by the candidate for preparation of merit list where the admission were made on merit basis.

- 39 The Students will be initially given provisional admission only subject to the verification of their documents. In case of any discrepancy noticed at any stage, the Principal of the college concerned is authorized to cancel the provisional admission. It shall be the sole responsibility of the student to confirm the eligibility as prescribed in the Prospectus/HBI issued by the College/University.

40. Before finalizing the admissions the updated list of recognized examinations of the UGC and the Board of School Education, Haryana, Bhiwani is also required to be consulted. www.ugc.ac.in

KASHMIRI MIGRANTS

The following concessions are admissible for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants (Annexure-VIII) for admission during academic session **2026-27**:

- i. Relaxation in cutoff percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.

- ii. Increase in intake capacity up to 5% Programme (s) wise.
- iii. Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
- iv. Waiving off domicile requirements for Kashmiri Migrants only. Kashmiri Pandits/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in the Kashmiri Valley need domicile certificate.

SUPERNUMERARY SEATS

1. 05 supernumerary seats in each Programme are reserved for Kashmiri Migrants out of them two seats will be allotted as a part of the Special Scholarship Scheme for Jammu & Kashmir for students from Jammu & Kashmir.
2. One additional seat shall be for NCC candidate who attended the Republic Day Parade & Camp in all Programmes over and above the sanctioned seats.
3. One additional seat shall be for NSS merit certificate holder who attended the Republic Day Parade Camp in all the Programmes over and above the sanctioned seats.
4. One additional seat in each Programme shall be for deserving Parsi Students.
5. One additional seat in each Programme shall be for the children who have lost both their parents during the COVID pandemic. If, he/she produce the certificate under PM CARES for children scheme 2021 issued by the Ministry of Women and Child Development.
6. Seats in each programme of UTDs and USGS shall be provided to the Orphan children (one for male and one for female in) from Sirsa and Fatehabad Districts except NCTE, BCI and PCI etc. courses. The fees, books and hostel facility will be provided to such students.

Rules regarding admission of foreign nationals

1. Upto 25% supernumerary seats are allocated for all the programs running in the University Campus.
2. The admission of foreign students in UG/PG program are hereby offered for the courses running in the Campus of CDLU, Sirsa for the Academic Session 2026-27.
3. The decisions would be applicable to all foreign nationals who apply for admission in UG/PG program in the CDLU, Sirsa.
4. Only the foreign students having a foreign passport and wards of Indians working in the Gulf countries shall be eligible to apply for admission to a particular course.
5. The applicants applying under this category need not appear for the entrance examination conducted for the purpose. The eligibility conditions for the foreign nationals would remain the same as for the Indian Nationals as per HBI of this University. The admissions would be given based on a merit list prepared on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying exam, other terms and conditions remaining same as that for Indian nationals. In case the University/Board is not included in the AIU list, the foreign student must obtain and submit Equivalence Certificate to this effect from the Association of Indian Universities. The link of AIU for this purpose is <https://evaluation.aiu.ac.in/Student/Login>
6. The medium of instructions would be English except in the subject of languages and it is presumed that any foreign student seeking admission in any language specific course has a prior knowledge of the language.
7. The foreign students admitted to UG/PG program will be charged fee as under:
 - (i) For Science subjects - USD 425 in equivalent INR currency per semester (for UG programs)
 - (ii) Other than Science - USD 325 in equivalent INR currency per semester (for UG programs)
 - (iii) For Science subjects - USD 525 in equivalent INR currency per semester (for PG programs)

- (iv) Other than Science - USD 425 in equivalent INR currency per semester (for PG programs)

Note: - The payment made in INR would be the conversion of rate (buying rate) of that date as per RBI regulation in this regard.

8. Other General Guidelines:

- (i) The guidelines would be applicable to all foreign nationals who apply for admission in UG/PG program in the CDLU, Sirsa.
 - (ii) The course on which eligibility is relied upon must be included in the list of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
 - (iii) The attestation of all documents essentially required to be done by the concerned Embassy/High Commission/Consulate of the relevant country in India. The documents without attestation shall be summarily rejected.
 - (iv) The foreign nationals/students applying from their own country should get their transcripts of certificates attested by the concerned accredited authorized Government agency and also duly certified by the Indian Embassy or Consulate as the case may be.
 - (v) English translation of transcripts of certificates duly attested should be provided/supplied wherever necessary.
 - (vi) A character certificate from the head of the institution last attended is mandatory for admission in UG/PG program.
 - (vii) Foreign students admitted to UG/PG program at CDLU Sirsa are required to obtain long term STUDENT VISA in the name of CDLU, Sirsa on the basis of admission within 45 days from the date of admission and submit it in the office of Dean, IR/FA, CDLU Sirsa. In case the student fails to do so, the University reserves the right to cancel admission and in such situation, the admitted student can make a claim for refunding his/her fee which will be refunded but after deducting 100 US dollars as the admission processing fee. The Vice Chancellor can condone the delay in submitting or procuring visa or any other documents required for continuing admission.
 - (viii) Following documents shall be submitted by the admitted students to the office of Dean, International Students' for police registration in Police Station within 14 days of his/her arrival: Attested photocopy of passport, visa, proof of residence, proof of admission and four passport size photographs and other such documents required by the office of the Dean IR/FA.
 - (ix) If the scholar is found to be indulging in any illegal activity, his/her admission would stand cancelled immediately.
9. All foreign nationals seeking admission to the University will be required to produce a medical certificate of fitness from a recognized hospital in their country. Those admitted may also be required to undergo a comprehensive medical examination (HIV, AIDS etc.) within a week from the date of the admission.
10. The final authority for interpreting the rules and guidelines given herein, or condonement of any nature, would rest with the Vice Chancellor.
11. In case of any dispute related to these terms and conditions and otherwise, the matter shall be subjected to the jurisdiction of the Civil Court, Sirsa, Haryana.
12. UGC guidelines for admission & creation of supernumerary seats of International students in UG & PG circulated vide memo No. DHE-170008/34/2023-NPE dated 02.01.2024 will be followed in University Teaching Departments and USGS.

Information about Programmes in Physical Education

1. Games & Events recognized by the AIU will be accepted for admission in MPED.
2. A married girl is eligible for admission to MPED Programme but, it is also compulsory for her to sign an undertaking that she will discontinue the programme at once for at least one academic

year, if she gets pregnant during the Programme(s) of study.

However, she can join back afresh from the beginning of the semester keeping in mind the guidelines pertaining to the maximum duration of the Programme(s).

3. Each student in department of Physical Education shall have to wear prescribed dress during the sports activities to be conducted in the morning and evening sessions. No student shall be allowed to attend the sports activities without proper dress.

Fees and Scholarships:-

1. **Fee will be charged from the student semester/year-wise as per the nature of the Academic Programme and as per the fee structure given in the notification of each Academic Programme.**
2. Department-wise Schedule will be notified by the Accounts Branch. Dues for the subsequent semester/years must be paid by the dates notified, shall be charged.
 - (i) A candidate whose result of the examination taken by him/her is notified as 'Later' may also be allowed to join the next higher class provisionally. In case he/she is ultimately declared as having failed, his/her provisional admission shall stand cancelled and he/she shall forthwith revert to the lower class. Fee paid by him/her for the higher class shall be adjusted against the lower class dues. No refund shall be admissible to the student who discontinues his/her studies. His/her attendance for the higher class will be counted for the lower class.
 - (ii) Students will deposit the fee on fixed date and time notified by Accounts Branch and will not be allowed to attend the class without depositing the fee. Students will deposit the fee online through Payment Gateway on fixed date and time.
3. Caution money/Security is refundable if application is received by 31st December of the year of the completion of Programme (application format as **Annexure-IX**).
4. The record of Admission fee/Examination fee slip be maintained/kept by the Department concerned only in the case of those who are entering into offline admissions. The Department concerned will mention fee receipt number on Financial Statement Performa while sending filled examination form to the Result Branch.
5. The fee shall be refunded/adjusted only in the first Semester of the Programme.
6. For the information of the old students who are enrolled in the SFS Programmes which have been discontinued, the fee of these programmes for remaining years will remain the same as it was mentioned in the concerned year HBI.

RULES FOR ADJUSTMENT/REFUND OF FEE:

1. If a candidate after having deposited fee for admission in one Programme joins another programme in another/same UTD in the same session, as mentioned below, and is permitted to withdraw his/her candidature, fee/funds except admission fee already deposited by him/her for the programme from which he/she has withdrawn, shall be adjusted/refunded against the fee/funds of the programme he/she joins subject to the condition that the difference, if any, shall be paid by the candidate:
 - i) From a budgeted programme to another budgeted programme;
 - ii) From a budgeted programme to a Self-financing programme or vice- versa.
 - iii) From a Self-financing programme to another Self-financing programme.

- Note:**
- i) In case, the fee paid by the candidate is higher in one programme, then the same will be adjusted in the next semester fee during transfer from one programme to another.
 - ii) In case, the fee paid by the candidate is lower in one programme, then he/she has to pay difference of fee at the time of admission during transfer from one programme to another.
 - iii) In above both cases, the candidate has to pay Processing Fee @ Rs. 500/- for each

transfer during admission.

- iv) In Self-financing Programmes, adjustment/refund of fee will be allowed only if the seat so vacated is filled by the last date of admission subject to filling up of all the seats.

2. For Budgeted Programmes:- In case a candidate leaves the University after getting admission in a particular Programme, following conditions will apply for refund of fee:

If a candidate leaves any Programme after 31st December 2026, proportionate deduction of fee up to the month of his/her leaving will be made from the date of commencement of classes up to month of his/her leaving the Programme, subject to minimum of Rs.1000/-. This is subject to the revision of the policy in this regard by UGC or the State Govt. as per UGC Notification D.O. No. F.12-5/2024(FNT/NET) Fee Nivaran (Notice) Dated: 27 Oct, 2025

If a student chooses to withdraw from the Programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of fees* remitted by the student.

Sr. No	Percentage of Refund of fees*	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received in the HEI
(1)	100%	15 days or more before the formally-notified last date of admission.
(2)	90%	Less than 15 days before the formally-notified last date of admission.
(3)	80%	15 days or less after the formally-notified last date of admission.
(4)	50%	30 days or less, but more than 15 days, after formally-notified last date of admission
(5)	00%	More than 30 days after formally- notified last date of admission.

* Caution money and security deposit, which are not part of the fees chargeable, shall be refunded in full.

In case of (1) in the table above, the HEI concerned shall deduct an amount not more than 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000/- as processing charges from the refundable amount.

Fee shall be refundable by all HEIs to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.

TUITION FEE CONCESSION:

- (a) Full Tuition Fee Concessions may be given to deserving students by the Dean, USGS/Chairperson of the department concerned up to 10% or half fee concession to 20% of the total number of students on roll in each class/department. Application in this regard will be submitted to the department by upto 31st October, 2026. The departments will decide the cases of tuition fee concession (1st and 2nd Semester) by 30th November, 2026 and send the recommendation to the Accounts Branch for necessary action.

The Vice-Chancellor may, in deserving cases, on the recommendation of the Dean, USGS/Chairperson of the Department may grant additional fee concessions up to 10% provided that not more than one such additional fee concession shall be awarded in any class.

- (b) Tuition Fee concessions may be allowed to two or more children of the same parents at the following rates:

- (i) The eldest to pay Full fee.
- (ii) The younger or younger ones to pay half fee.

The Concessions will be allowed even if the elder brother/sister is studying in a University maintained Institution other than the one in which the younger brother(s)/sister(s) is/are studying.

- (c) 50% Tuition Fee concession to only girl / only two girl child(ren) (of parents without any male child) at U.G/Graduate level.
- (d) 1st, 2nd and 3rd position at the National Level competition organized by the Govt. agencies in similar events in sports and cultural sphere.
- (e) Development Fee concession may be allowed to anyone of the two brothers/sisters on admission to the same Programme in the University Teaching Department during the same session.
- (f) Fee concession to University employees and their dependents:
50% concession of total fee (except examination fee and registration fee) to the University employee and their dependents (sons, daughters, brothers, sisters, spouse, who is/are not working and is/are fully dependent on him/her and living with him/her) may be allowed in part-time/regular programmes, self-financing programmes in the University Teaching Departments and the programmes in the University Centre for Distance Learning.
- (g) The children of serving military personnel up to the rank of an NCO or of military personnel killed or incapacitated wholly or partially during the war, shall be allowed Full Tuition Fee Concession.
- (h) Blind students may on an application be granted Full Tuition Fee Concession.
- (i) Further, Aid may be provided to the students as per Students' Aid Fund Clause No. 3.
- (j) Tuition fee concession may be granted at the time of admission to the deserving divyang students according to their percentage of disability. For example if a student has 50% disability, then 50% tuition fee concession will be granted and if a student has 100% disability then 100% tuition fee concession will be granted at the time of admission.
- (k) The fee concession to Divyang for Hand Book of Information Fee (Prospectus) will be at par with SC/BC candidates

Note: Free Education for Dependent Children of Leprosy Affected Persons (LAPs):

No fee/dues will be charged from the dependent children of Leprosy Affected Persons and education in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes will be free for them.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE TO SC/DSC/BC CANDIDATES

1. For SC/DSC/BC candidates, the price of Handbook of Information/registration fees is 1/4th of the price fixed for open and other categories.
2. No fee will be charged by the USGS/college from the students belonging to the SC category as per instructions under the Post Matric Scholarship Scheme by the Director Higher Education, Haryana and the Director, Technical Education Haryana,

for technical Programme(s) approved by AICTE.

3. For the Post Matric Scholarship Scheme of GOI for welfare of SC as per letter No.3/44-2012 Sch (2) dated 18.06.2013 of the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula SC students whose family income from all sources is up to Rs. 2.50 lac per annum are eligible for benefits under the scheme. The benefits include enrollment/registration, tuition, games, Union, Library, Magazine, Medical Examination and such other fees compulsorily payable by the student to the institution or University/Board. Refundable deposit like caution money, security deposit are, however, excluded. For students admitted under this scheme, the application form has to be submitted by the students to the concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/ Institute as per the date to be advertised/notified by the government.

Note: An income declaration will be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardian of SC candidates, stating definite income from all sources by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper. Employed parents/guardian are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources, they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper. SC scholarships shall be awarded by the State Government to eligible SC students (as per eligibility guidelines) enrolled in a programme. Post Matric Scholarships are granted to SC/DSC/BC students under Govt. of India Scheme (Annexure-X)

4. The USGS/Department will decide the eligibility for scholarship of such candidates on the basis of guidelines/norms given in the HBI.
5. Students who are eligible for Scheduled Caste and Backward Class Scholarship(s) as the case may be, may apply online on the dates which will be announced/published in the newspapers web portal of the State Govt./Funding Agencies
6. Students belonging to the SC/DSC/BC category who are eligible for Post Matric Scholarship Scheme should get their Saving Bank Account linked with Aadhaar Card to get transferred the funds in their respective bank accounts.
7. As per Memo No. Edu-1/2018/30135-160 dated 01.08.2018 and 3/31-2018(2) dated 22.04.2019 (Annexure-XI). "All institutions are requested to verify the eligibility criteria of SC students for award of PMS-SC scholarship, and if found eligible, the date for depositing the fee for such SC students may be extended till scholarship amount is transferred to his/her account by the Govt. IF required, institution may take an assurance from such students that they will deposit the fee to institution within 10 days from the date they receive the same in their account"
8. **Those SC/DSC students who are not eligible in the scholarship will pay fee/dues at par with General category students, along with the admission form.** The SC/DSC students eligible for this scholarship will be themselves responsible for filling up Scholarship Forms as per schedule to be intimated by Registration & Scholarship Branch failing which they will have to deposit full fee within one month of the last date for filling scholarship forms. **Late fee will be levied on such students.** The eligibility for scholarship of such candidates will be decided by the Department, on the basis of guidelines/norms given in the HBI. Such students will submit their non-dues certificate before taking the final semester examination otherwise their **DMC or Duplicate DMC or Provisional Degree or Duplicate Degree will not be issued. In case the SC/DSC candidates leave the programme before the completion of program his/her Migration Certificate will be withheld till he/she clears all the dues.**
9. It will be the responsibility of the students to enclose necessary documents to claim fee concession and file application for scholarship.

Interpretation of Rules and Remedies and other Important Information

1. Nothing contained in the Handbook of Information would be construed to convey sanction or cited as an authority. Whenever there is inconsistency or contradiction, the University Ordinances and the Regulations contained in Calendars Vol. I, II, III of CDLU, Sirsa are to be referred.
2. In the event of any inconsistency with regard to the rules framed for admission etc. or in the event of any clarification with respect to the above said rules, the matter shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor and the interpretation given by the Vice-Chancellor shall be final. The Vice-Chancellor is also competent to remove any inconsistency and to decide as to which provision shall take precedence over the other.

If any applicant or any other person is of the opinion that in his/her case, the rules framed for admission etc. have not been followed, he/she shall make an application outlining clearly the deviation in his/her opinion to the Vice-Chancellor. The Vice-Chancellor shall consider the application in the light of relevant rules and his decision in the matter shall be final.

3. If, at any stage, it is found that the candidate has supplied any incomplete or false or incorrect information in the application form, his/her candidature/enrolment for the programme shall be cancelled and he/she shall be liable for disciplinary action as per the University rules.
4. Admitted regular students will have to see the Notice Board for information pertinent to them. No separate information will be sent to them at their home address.
5. Students shall have to keep their Identity Cards with them while on campus. They can get their ID-cards from the Dean, USGS/ concerned Chairperson, UTDs. No entry would be allowed without ID-Card.
6. Any legal dispute relating to admission of a student shall be subject to jurisdiction of the Courts at Sirsa.

1. Those students who seek admission in the next programme in this University will pay Rs 500/- as continuation fees.
2. Library Security of Rs. 1000/- from UTD's students shall be charged from students on admission for full programme and the same shall be refundable after completion of degree on producing No Dues Certificate.
3. The financial assistance may be given to the deserving poor students from the "Students Aid Fund" as per University rules. The students will have to apply to the Dean Students Welfare for financial assistance.
4. Department-wise Schedule will be notified by the Accounts Branch. Dues for the subsequent years must be paid by the dates notified failing which fine shall be charged.
5. The fee shall be refunded/adjusted only in the first Semester of the programme.
6. The letter received from the Director Higher Education, Haryana vide memo No. 18/54-2025 UNP (3) Dated 08/04/2025 and recommends to wave off the tuition fees of girls students studying in B.Sc. Courses in the University whose family Annual Income is less than three lakh.
7. The examination fees @ Rs. 1000/- per semester will be applicable for regular students of UTDs, USGS and affiliated colleges admitted w.e.f. the Session 2025-26.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

- (A) 15% of the total seats shall be open and will be filled on All India basis including Haryana.
- (B) Remaining 85% seats are reserved for bona fide residents of Haryana and will be filled up as detailed below:

The seat matrix has been prepared on the basis of the reservation policy notified by the Govt. of Haryana vide Notification No. 22/10/2013 – IGSIII dated 28/2/2013 and 22/12/2019-1GS.III dated 25.02.2019, and instructions received from the State Govt. from time to time on the following basis:

In the event of quota reserved for Physically Handicapped remain unfilled due to non-availability for suitable category of Handicapped Candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Further, 3% reservation is also provided to Ex-serviceman/ Freedom Fighter and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General Category, 1% out of Scheduled Caste and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided / Institutes located in Haryana. As far as Block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes category is concerned year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example if Block-A of Backward Classes are given seats in academic year 2014, the next Block i.e. (B) Block of Category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year 2015 and so on. Further, a roster register for reservation of seats for ex- servicemen/freedom fighter shall be maintained and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes to one a seat will be provided. The Chairperson of the Department concerned shall maintain the record for the purpose.

Definitions of Disabilities:

Definitions of categories of disabilities are given below:

- (I) (a) Blindness: “Blindness” refers to a condition where a person suffers from any of the following conditions namely:-
- i) Total absence of sight; or
 - ii) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (Snellen chart) in the better eye with correcting lenses; or
 - (iii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse:
- Low vision: ‘Person with low vision’ means a person with impairment of visual functioning even after treatment or standard refractive correction but who uses or is potentially capable of using vision for the planning or execution of a task with appropriate assistive device.

- (II) Hearing Impairment: “Hearing Impairment” means loss of sixty decibels or more in the better ear in the conversational range of frequencies.
- (III) (a) Locomotor disability: “Locomotor disability” means disability of the bones, joints or muscles leading to substantial restriction of the movement of the limbs or any form of cerebral palsy.
- (b) Cerebral Palsy: “Cerebral Palsy” means a group of non-progressive conditions of a person characterized by abnormal motor control posture resulting from brain insult or injuries occurring in the pre-natal, pre-natal or infant period of development.
- (c) All the cases of orthopedically handicapped persons would be covered under the category of “locomotor disability or cerebral palsy”.

Guidelines for Reservation:

1. The Reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment by the State govt. from time to time.
2. In case seats of DSC remains vacant, the same will be filled up from the SC candidates and vice versa. Similarly, if the reserved seat(s) of BC Block ‘A’ remain vacant these will be filled up from BC Block ‘B’ and vice versa. Further, if the reserved seats of EWS category remains vacant, then these will be filled up from HOGC/AI open as the case may be.
3. If a candidate of Haryana General, SC and BC also applies for Differently Abled/ESM/DFF category, he/she will be considered first for Haryana General, SC and BC category.
4. If the quota reserved for Differently Abled Persons candidates remains vacant due to non-availability of candidates, these seats will be given to ESM and their wards, dependents of Freedom Fighters and wards of Military Personnel who died in operation ‘Vijay’ on the basis of their merit.
5. In case the number of applications is/falls less than the number of sanctioned seats in any Programme, the vacant seats under reserved categories except SC will be filled as follows:
 - I. The seats remaining vacant in any other Reserved Category shall be filled from Haryana Open category, if the candidate belonging to the respective category is not available at the time of physical presence.
 - II. Further, in case, the seats remain vacant in Haryana Open category, the same will also be thrown open to All India Open category.
 - III. In case the number of applications received in any category is less than the number of sanctioned seats, all the vacant seats will be thrown open to as per the above two clauses.
 - IV. **No SC/DSC seat will be converted into General category.**
 - V. Roster System will not be maintained in case of admissions as per Haryana Govt. instructions.
 - VI. Further, in case the candidate of reserved category approaches the University that he could not present himself at the time of physical presence or one day before the close of admission in case of SC category, on sufficient ground and reserved seat has been filled up from the general category candidates, the proposal for additional seat(s) for that candidate will be put up by the concerned Department within 7 days. (For details refer to chapter Reservation).
 - VII. Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste, Backward Class (Block ‘A’ & ‘B’) and EWS (**Govt. notification and certificate available at www.cdlu.ac.in**) categories will submit the certificate as per **Annexure-XV**, **XVI** and affidavit as per **Annexure-XVII** regarding income proof to decide creamy layer category, respectively.
6. Certificate from ward of Deceased/Disabled/Discharged Military/Para-Military personnel/Ex Servicemen or Ex-Personnel of Para-Military Forces – **Annexure-XVIII must be enclosed with the admission form for taking the benefit of reservation.**
 The seats reserved for ESM category shall be offered in order of following priorities:
 - a) Wards of Ex-servicemen died in action while in active service.

- b) Ex-serviceman himself.
 - c) Wards of Ex-servicemen.
 - d) Wards of Paramilitary Forces.
7. Only the candidates having permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the Programme(s)) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. Disability certificate must be issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District. The Admission Committee can recommend for verification in case of any doubt to the concerned Chief Medical Officer. Differently abled candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per **Annexure-XIX**.
 8. Children and Grand-Children of Freedom Fighters of Haryana are required to submit a certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner of the concerned District as per **Annexure-XX**.
 9. ESM and their wards of Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per **Annexure-XXI**.
 10. For horizontal reservation, ESM/DFP candidates of General, SC and BC category will also have to furnish ESM/DFP certificate as mentioned above.
 11. In pursuance of the decision of Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh dated 11.01.2013 in the LPA 98/2013 (O&M) CWP No. 20359 of 2012, Sh. Ishwar Singh Vs KUK & Others, preference shall be given to ESM first before giving admission to wards against ESM reserved seats.
 12. Eligible candidates whether from Haryana or from reserved categories will compete for seats allocated under All India Category.
 13. A candidate, who applies for reserved category will be considered first in general category. In case, he/she does not get a seat of his/her choice in general category, then he/she will be considered for reserved category as applicable. The category of allotted seat may be higher than the actual category of the candidate.
 14. If the number of seats in any particular category is not a round figure, 0.5 or above will be taken as one and less than 0.5 shall be ignored, except that in Physically Handicapped, Children & Grandchildren of Freedom Fighters and Ex-Servicemen and their Wards Categories, at least one candidate will be admitted from all the three categories in total, even if the share is less than 0.5 seats provided the number of sanctioned intake in the particular Programme(s) is 30 or above.
 15. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a university in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit certificates of bona fide residents of Haryana.
 16. In case of tie for admission against sports seats, the applicant who has won position in higher tournament will be admitted.
 17. A person belonging to the General Category married to a person belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Backward Classes, shall not be entitled to the benefit of reservation vide letter no. 22/76/2012-GSIII dated 22.03.2012 from Chief Secretary to Govt., Haryana.
 18. The State Govt. of Haryana has decided to provide following concessions to the students belonging to Jammu & Kashmir for their admissions in the Colleges and Universities of Haryana.
 - (i) Relaxation in cut-off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
 - (ii) Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course-wise.
 19. The Govt. Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS.III dated 25.02.2019 for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) is attached at Annexure-XXII.
 20. The letter received from Haryana Government Chief Secretary Organization Human Resources Department Chandigarh, the 13th November, 2024 No. 22/163/2024-5HR-III, list of Deprived Scheduled Caste and Other Scheduled Caste in Haryana State is attached at Annexure-XXIII.

Distributions of Seats:-

1. The Highest percentage 0.5 or above has been rounded subject to the fact that no increase to the total number of seats.
2. 30% seats shall be horizontal reserved for female candidates in each category for MPed programmes.
3. **Further, 3% reservation is also provided to Ex-serviceman/Freedom Fighter and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General Category, 1% out of Scheduled Caste and 1% from Backward Class Category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided/Institutes located in Haryana.
4. The State Reservation Policy is being followed.
5. **The reservation policy of State of Haryana applied.**

Note:

1. The category-wise distribution of seats given above is according to the letter issued by the General Administration Department Haryana Government through Letter No. 22/10/2013-1GSIII dated 15.07.2014, 22/149/2015-IGSIII dated 01.04.2016 and 22/12/2019-1GS.III dated 25.02.2019.
2. The reservation in admission to the EWS candidates shall be given as per the Guidelines and Instructions supplied by the State Government i.e. 10% is to be given in both State Quota seats under State Policy and All India Quota seats under Central Government Policy separately (Annexure-XXVII).
3. Two supernumerary seats will be created as a part of the Special Scholarship Scheme for Jammu & Kashmir for students from Jammu & Kashmir. (Reference: Chapter-2, point-17).
4. There shall be two additional seats in PG programmes (except the programmes where the seats have been approved by NCTE/BCI etc.) and five additional seats in UG Programmes (except the programmes where the seats have been approved by NCTE/BCI etc.) over and above the sanctioned seats for Outstanding Sports Persons. For admission against such seats, the candidate will be required to submit the grading certificate of sports issued by the Director of Sports and Youth Welfare, Govt. of Haryana, Chandigarh.

Note: Weightage for sports will be given only in respect of tournaments in the games/events arranged by the university/inter-university/sports board or by a State/National Organization recognized by the Indian Olympic Association:

In the above categories, the weightage will be calculated as under:

- The total weightage for merit (A to E above) shall not exceed 10 merit points.**
- The number of students admitted under Clause (E) above shall not exceed 10% of the total intake of the programme.
- The Weightage for the purpose of merit under clause (c) above shall be given only if the candidate has obtained the required certificate/distinction from first public examination to the qualifying examination on the basis of which he is seeking admission to the programme. For example, if a candidate is seeking admission on the basis of BA/ B.Sc./B Com Examination, he/she will be given Weightage under this clause if he/she has obtained certificate of distinction in Matric, 10+2 and in BA/BSc/B.Com, as the case may be.
- Weightage for M.P.Ed. as per Appendix-A.
- A weightage of 5 merit points shall be admissible to the candidate who have passed BSc with Biotechnology as one of the subject for admission in MSc Biotechnology.

Registration and Migration Rules

The concerned department will check the eligibility for admission at its own level and send the Registration Return to the Registration & Scholarship Branch. The Registration Branch will generate PRN (online) to the provisionally admitted candidates.

Note: The Candidates who have passed their qualifying examinations from a University/Board situated outside India, will have to deposit eligibility fee of Rs. 500/-. They will have to deposit the documents including visa in the Registration Branch. Even provisional admission will not be allowed without the eligibility certificate.

Admission of students in no case should exceed the sanctioned strength of each Class/Programme. The Dean, Academic Affairs will exercise control and supervise the admissions in the UTDs and in the Colleges respectively. A copy of the details showing sanctioned strength of each class/Programme/subject be prepared on prescribed format by the Principal/Chairperson, which is required to be sent along with the Registration Returns. Any delay in this regard will be viewed seriously. Admissions of students will be made only in such class/Programme/subject where the University has granted permission/affiliation.

Registration return will be filed with the name of the candidate, his/her father & mother name and name of the college, both in English and Hindi. The admission committee of the concerned department/institute will be responsible for any error in the spellings and DMCs and Degrees will be based on them.

It may be ensured that the children of single parent are not denied admission in the College/Department on the plea that names of both the parents are not mentioned in the certificate of qualifying examination/admission form, if they are otherwise eligible/ subject to fulfillment of all other conditions of admission.

Principals/ Chairpersons must ensure that admissions are made subject to the fulfillment of the minimum eligibility conditions. Registration Returns of all such cases be sent on prescribed format and legible photocopies of the lower qualifying examination, duly attested by the Authority as detailed above, must accompany the same. For regularization of admission of such students, duly attested photocopies of the certificates of the examination Passed by the candidate(s) in supplementary as well as annual examination be sent personally to Registration and Scholarship Branch immediately after the declaration of the result.

No regular student will be allowed to appear in the examination of the University until and unless his/her Registration Return has been sent to the University.

Registration Return (RR) will be submitted as per schedule of R&S.

Migration Rules

A student from any other University recognized by CDLU, Sirsa or from a Board of Examination other than the Board of School Education, Haryana, shall be eligible for admission to the University only on production of the migration certificate (or transfer certificate if a Board does not issue the migration certificate) to show that the University or the Board has no objection to his/her joining this University and he/she will have to submit the same up to 30th November, 2026 without any late fee, failing which his/her candidature for the concerned examination shall stand suspended automatically, provided that the condition of production of the migration certificate shall not apply in the case of students passing their examination from Foreign University.

For the session 2026-27, the last date for submission of Migration Certificate will be 30th November, 2026 without late fee and same will be accepted through concerned Chairperson/ Principal even after 30th November, 2026 on payment of late fee upto the dates mentioned below:

Migration from College to College of CDLU/ from other University to CDLU/ affiliated College to CDLU/CDLU to affiliated College/Inter University Migration in 2nd year onwards will be permitted with a fee of Rs. 20,000/- for professional programmes and Rs. 100/- for other than professional programmes. If the Principals of both the Colleges agree to the migration then the application be forwarded to Registrar for sanction through the Principals of both the Colleges accompanied with the prescribed fee.

ATTENDANCE/CLASS PARTICIPATION

1. In each programme, (except the programme approved by the BCI) every student will have to fulfill the condition of 75% minimum (theory & practical separately) of attendance as per the relevant is mandatory. (However, for the students in department of Law, the minimum attendance required is 70%).
2. Dean, USGS/Chairperson are authorized to condone 10% of the shortage by recording the reason. Further, the Vice Chancellor may further condone extra 15% of lecture shortage.
3. Ordinarily, a candidate who has not attended the required percentage of lectures/practical, *etc.* in a particular subject, as prescribed shall not be eligible to appear in the concerned course/subject examination. If the Dean of USGS/Chairperson of the Department is not satisfied with the reasons for the shortage given by the student, it is not obligatory on his/her part to condone the shortage. The decision of the Dean of USGS/Chairperson of the Department shall be final.
4. Every student shall attend his classes on all working days unless he is granted leave of absence by the Dean, USGS/Chairperson.
5. If a student remains absent from his classes for a continuous period of seven working days each in one **subject/paper/Programme(s)** without any valid reason, medical or otherwise, his name shall be struck off from the rolls, irrespective of the fact that he/she has paid his/her dues.
6. However, the student may be re-admitted with the permission of the Dean, USGS/Chairperson of the Department concerned on payment of re-admission fee, as prescribed by the University from time to time in addition to arrears of fees, if any, provided that the Dean, USGS/Chairperson is satisfied that if re-admitted the student will not fall short of requisite percentage of lectures etc.
7. For allowing readmission by the Dean, USGS/Chairperson UTDs and Vice Chancellor in an academic year with readmission fee as follows:

1 st instance	Rs. 1000/- + Rs. 50/- per day upto 10 days from the date of notification and Rs. 2000/- + Rs. 50/- per day from 11 to 20 days by Dean, USGS/Chairperson UTDs subject to the condition of attendance requirement. After 20 days from the date of notification, the Vice Chancellor may allow re-admission with a fine of Rs. 3000/-.
2 nd instance	Rs. 2000/- + Rs. 50/- per day by Dean, USGS/Chairperson upto 10 days from the date of notification subject to the condition of attendance requirement. After 10 days from the date of notification, the Vice Chancellor may allow re-admission with a fine of Rs. 3000/-.
8. Distribution of Marks for attendance/class participation will be as under:

Attendance/class participation for 60%	02
Attendance/class participation (61% to 75%)	03
Attendance/class participation (76% to 85%)	04
Attendance/class participation above 85%	05

The students will abide by the attendance rules even if the classes are online.

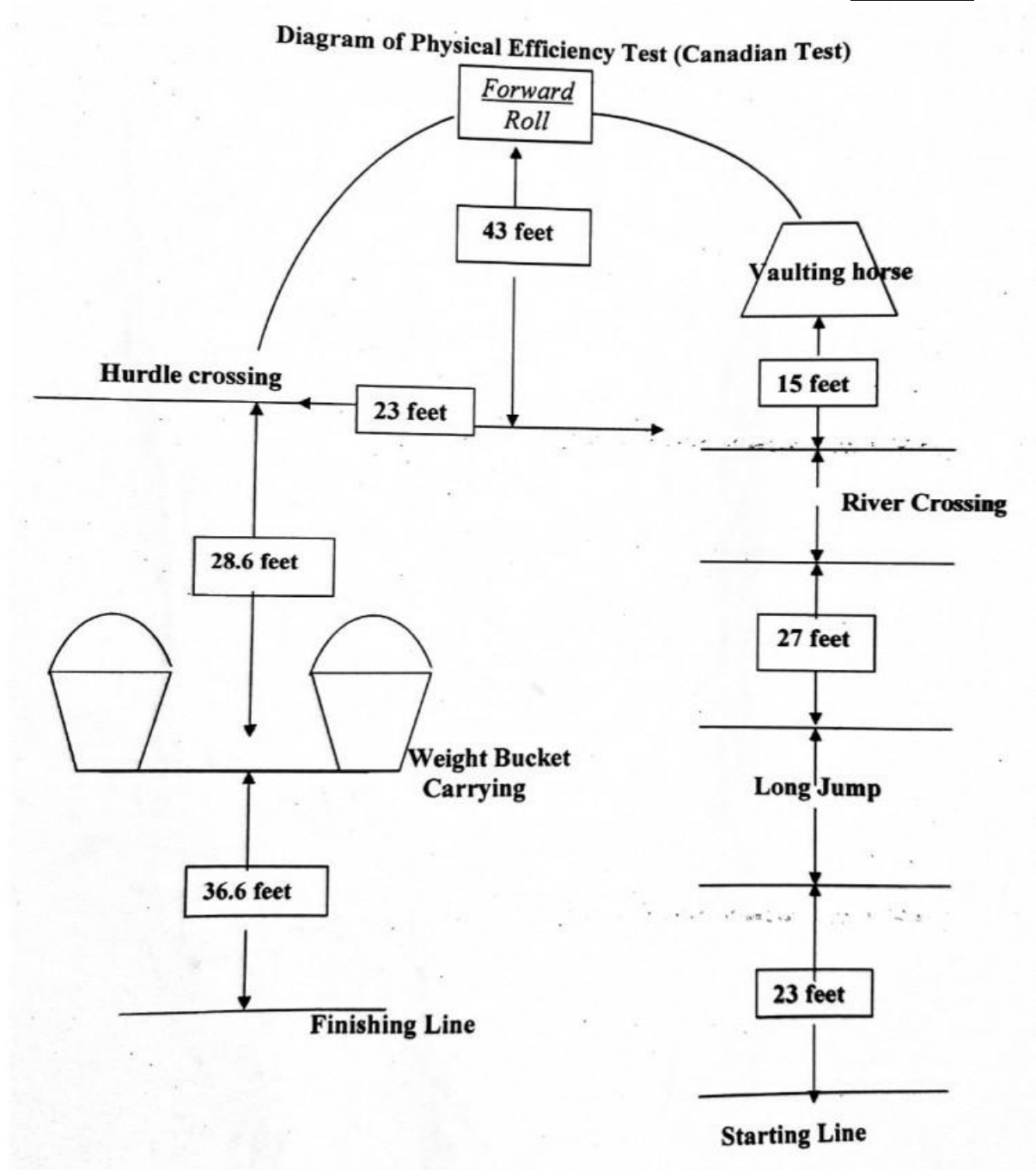
**RULES FOR PROMOTION TO NEXT/HIGHER CLASS

A. RULES FOR PROMOTION TO NEXT/HIGHER SEMESTER/CLASS

All students of the programme will be provisionally admitted to next semester subject to deposition of fee and on rolls in the previous semester. For BA LLB 5 year Integrated programme, the rules of concerned regulatory body will be implemented.

B. IMPROVEMENT

After passing the examination, one chance in each semester may be given for improvement of marks in the programmes where provision of improvement exists. The syllabus will be the same as meant for the regular candidates of the semester(s) concerned.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

1. If a candidate commits two faults, he/she will not be allowed for re-test, whereas if only one fault is committed by the candidate, he/she will be given one more chance provided he/she completes the test within the prescribed time. Third chance will not be given under any circumstance.
2. Hurdles should be crossed without being knocked down. If a candidate leaves the test incomplete he/she will be disqualified and will not be given any chance. If any candidate falls or slips while performing the test he/she must complete the test and should not drop out in between and no extra chance would be given in such cases.

- (1) Highest Sports weightage- on one count will be given.

- (5) No weightage will be given for rural festivals/open memorial tournaments/ invitation meets/women festivals etc.

The games included in list of AIU will only be considered for weightage. The certificate will only be considered if the same bears gradation from the respective State Governments in respect of the game /sports for which the candidate claims sports weightage and eligibility. In case any state does not issue gradation certificate, the candidate shall have to produce a certificate to that effect from the Director of sports of the concerned state. The District Sports Officer/Head of the Institution shall countersign these certificates. The certificates of Haryana Universities will be verified by the Secretary, Sports Council, of their respective Universities, hence they do not need gradation certificate.

A graduate who has participated or won positions at a,b,c,d, e and f must have played for his university at inter university tournaments except in the case that he/she did his/her gradation through distance education.

Subject: Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOII-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g. :-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under :-

Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5

Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100

Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be 50 - 2.50 = 47.50 and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.

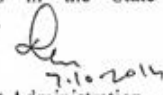

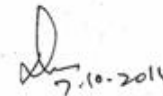

Devender Singh, ACSSDIT apprised that Haryana Board of School Education (HBSE), Bhiwani has recently provided equivalency to ITI courses (entry qualification 8th and 10th) with 10th or 10+2 for the purpose of vertical mobility into higher education as well as for employment opportunities. He also told that around 2321 ITI pass outs had appeared in the language exam taken by HBSE in July, 2019 & 63% have been got the equivalency certificate from HBSE and 92% trainees have opted the Hindi language. According to the granted HBSE equivalency to ITI pass outs, two separate issues are to be addressed as the following:

- In case of International/National participation or Position Holder, a certificate of authenticity will be required from concerned National Federation/State Association.
- In case of Inter University Participation or Inter University Position Holder other than Kurukshetra University, a certificate of authenticity from the Head of Sports of the concern University will be required.
- The game/event must be in the scheduled list of Association of Indian University Sports Calendar.
- The tournament must be organised by recognised Federation/Association duly affiliated with State Olympic Association/Indian Olympic Association and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
- Achievement during the course of Graduate and Post-Graduate studies will be considered for admission in Post-Graduate courses including Law (3 Year).
- No sports achievement lower than the above will be considered for admission for outstanding sports person category, even if the seats remain vacant.

Criteria to decide the Merit

- In case of tie in the sports achievement level then the maximum number of achievements at the same level of the minimum eligibility under sports criteria will be taken into account for deciding the merit.
- If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Entrance Test will be considered for deciding the merit.
- If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Qualifying Exam. will be considered for deciding the merit.
- If still there is tie, then the age will be considered for the merit (Higher in the age will be considered for the merit).

No weightage will be given for participating/winning positions in the sports and games organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra, CBSE Nationals /Vidya Bharti Nationals /Rural Tournaments / Panchayat Tournaments /Novaodya Nationals and invitation non-recognised tournaments/sports festivals.

2. NORMS, GUIDELINES & CRITERIA TO DECIDE THE MERIT FOR 10 SEATS IN ARTS, 05 SEATS IN SCIENCE AND 05 SEATS IN COMMERCE FOR OUTSTANDING SPORTS PERSONS IN T.D.C. PART- I & TWO (02) SEATS IN INTEGRATED COURSES

Norms For Outstanding Sports Person : Outstanding sports person means a person who has atleast participated in School Nationals/Junior National/Youth National/National School Games in [under 19/17 (nineteen/ seventeen) year Age Group] or above in the preceding three years.

Guidelines for Sports Seats

Sports Certificate for admission will only be considered, if the candidate produce the Gradation Certificate from the respective Govt. in respect of the game/sports for which the candidate claim outstanding sports person seat.

In case any state does not issue the Gradation Certificate, the following criteria will be adopted :

- In case of International/ National participation or Position Holder, a certificate of authenticity will be required from concerned National Federation/State Association.
- In case of Inter University Participation or Inter University Position Holder other than Kurukshetra University, a certificate of authenticity from the Director Sports/Head of Sports of the concern University will be required.
- The game/event must be in the scheduled list of Association of Indian University Sports Calendar.
- The tournament must be organised by recognised Federation / Association duly affiliated with State Olympic Association/ Indian Olympic Association and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
- Achievements of the proceeding three years will be considered for Under-Graduate courses.
- No sports achievement lower than the above will be considered for admission for outstanding sports person category, even if the seats remain vacant.

Criteria to decide the Merit

- In case of tie in the Sports achievement level then the maximum number of achievements at the same level of the minimum eligibility under sports criteria will be taken into account for deciding the merit.
- If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Entrance Test will be considered for deciding the merit.
- If still there is tie, then the marks obtained in the Qualifying Exam. will be considered for deciding the merit.
- If still there is tie, then the age will be considered for the merit (higher in the age will be considered for the merit).

No weightage will be given for participating/winning positions in the sports and games organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra/CBSE National, Vidya Bharti Nationals/Rural Tournaments/Panchayat Tournaments /Novaodya Nationals and invitation non-recognised tournaments /sports festivals.

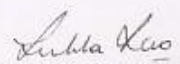

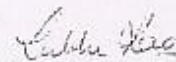

- (i) Relaxation in cut-off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
 - (ii) Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course-wise.
 - (iii) Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
 - (iv) Waiving off domicile requirements for Kashmiri Migrants only. Kashmiri Pandits/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in the Kashmir Valley need domicile certificate.

**Subject: Bona fide Residents of Haryana – Guidelines
regarding**

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letter on the subject noted above vide which the instruction were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institutions (including technical/medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and other reported as AIR 1984.SC.1421, where in it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions. Henceforth

the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident certificate:

- a. Candidates who have passed the examinations qualifying them for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
- b. Children/wards (if parents are not living) Dependent:
 - i. of the regular employees of Haryana State Posted in/outside Haryana State or working on deputation.
 - ii. of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in /outside Haryana;
 - iii. of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
- c. Children/wards (if parents not living) dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pension from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
- d. Children/Wards (if parents not living)/ dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a State other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or out side Haryana.
- e. Children/Wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who have permanently home in the Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living out side Haryana
- f. The wives of such persons who are bona fide resident of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage.
- g. Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/Guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
 - i. Citizen of India;
 - ii. Produce an affidavit to the effect they or their children/ wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
2. All candidates claiming to be Bona fide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate / General Assistant of Deputy Commissioner of Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-divisional to which the candidates belong. Residents Certificate in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/dependents of Haryana Govt. Employee who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere in respect Haryana in connection with affairs of Haryana Govt. or in respect of Children/Wards/dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory bodies/ Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana and outside Haryana, should be issued by their respective heads of Departments.
3. Candidates seeking admission in the Educational Institutions (including medical and technical

institutions) located in Haryana may not be required to produce resident certificate, if they have passed the Examination from a School/College situated in Haryana. For this purpose a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster of the Institution shall, be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.

4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim is false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal may take such other action against the students and his /her parents/ Guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.

Subject:- Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections in Direct recruitment in Civil posts and services as well as in admissions in Government/Government Aided Educational Institutions in the State of Haryana.

I am directed to inform that Government of India has notified "THE CONSTITUTION (ONE HUNDRED AND THIRD AMENDMENT) ACT, 2019" on 12th January, 2019 amending Article 15 & 16, which now read as under:-

Amendment of article 15

In Article 15 of the Constitution, after clause (5), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:—

'(6) Nothing in this article or sub-clause (g) of clause (1) of article 19 or clause (2) of article 29 shall prevent the State from making,—

(a) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5); and

(b) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5) in so far as such special provisions relate to their admission to educational institutions including private educational institutions, whether aided or unaided by the State, other than the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30, which in the case of reservation would be in addition to the existing reservations and subject to a maximum of ten per cent. of the total seats in each category.

Explanation— For the purposes of this article and article 16, "economically weaker sections" shall be such as may be notified by the State from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.'



Amendment of article 16

In Article 16 of the Constitution, after clause (5), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

"(6) Nothing in this article shall prevent the State from making any provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favour of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clause (4), in addition to the existing reservation and subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the posts in each category".

In the wake of above enabling provisions, State Government has considered the matter and decided to provide benefits of reservation on a preferential basis in Civil Posts in all its Departments/ Boards/ Corporations/Local Bodies and in Admissions to Government/Government Aided Educational Institutions to those Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for the Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B).



QUANTUM OF RESERVATION:

The persons belonging to EWSs who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) shall get 10% reservation in direct recruitment to Group A,B,C and D posts in the Departments/ Boards/Corporations/Local Bodies of Government of Haryana and also in admission to Government/Government Aided Educational Institutions in the State of Haryana.

1. EFFECTING RESERVATION - ROSTER POINT:

1.1 Direct recruitment in case of Group- A & B

Roster point No. 11-20-30-40-57-60-70-80-90 and 99

1.2 Direct recruitment in case of Group- C & D

Roster point No. 4-14-24-34-43-53-66-76-83 and 94

1.3, Where in any recruitment year any vacancy, earmarked for EWS cannot be filled up due to non availability of a suitable candidate belonging to EWS, such vacancies for that particular recruitment year shall not be carried forward to the next recruitment year as backlog and will be filled from unreserved category.

1.4 Persons belonging to EWS selected against the quota for persons with benchmark disabilities/ex-servicemen shall be placed against the roster points earmarked for EWS.

4. CRITERIA OF INCOME & ASSETS:

4.1 Persons who are not covered under the exiting scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs 6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.

4.2 Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-

- i. 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- v. Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore or more.

4.3 The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

4.4 The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.

5. INCOME AND ASSET CERTIFICATE ISSUING AUTHORITY AND VERIFICATION OF CERTIFICATE:

5.1 The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.

5.2 The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be as provided at Annexure-I.

5.3 The Officer who issues the certificate would do the same after carefully verifying all relevant documents following due process as prescribed by the State.

5.4 The crucial date for submitting Income and Asset Certificate by the candidate may be treated as the closing date for receipt of application for the post, except in cases where crucial date is fixed otherwise.

5.5 The appointing authorities should, in the offer of appointment to the candidates claiming to be belonging to EWS, include the following clause :-

"The appointment is provisional and is subject to the Income and asset certificate being verified through the proper channels and if the verification reveals that the claim to belong to EWS is fake/false the services will be terminated forthwith without assigning any further reasons and without prejudice to such further action as may be taken under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code for production of fake/false certificate."

The appointing authority should verify the veracity of the Income and asset certificate submitted by the candidate through the certificate issuing authority.

5.6 Instructions referred to above should be strictly followed so that it may not be possible for an unscrupulous person to secure employment on the basis of a false claim and if any person gets an appointment on the basis of such false claim, her/his services shall be terminated and penal action shall also be invoked.

6. ADJUSTMENT AGAINST UNRESERVED VACANCIES:

A person belonging to EWS cannot be denied the right to compete for appointment against an unreserved vacancy. Persons belonging to EWS who are selected on the basis of merit and not on account of reservation are not to be counted towards the quota meant for reservation.

7. The above scheme of reservation will be effective in respect of all direct recruitment vacancies to be notified on or after 01.02.2019.

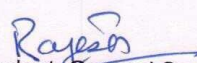

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to Government instructions issued vide No. 22/10/2013-1GS-III, dated 15.07.2014 and thereafter regarding rate(s) of reservation in Govt. jobs and to say that in compliance of the judgement dated 01.08.2024 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case titled "State of Punjab v/s Davinder Singh (CA No. 2317 of 2011) with regard to sub-classification and adequacy of representation, the matter was referred to the Haryana State Commission for Scheduled Castes for examination and to send their recommendations to address intra-community disparities and to ensure a fair and equitable distribution of reservation benefits. The Commission submitted their report on 16th August, 2024 prepared on the basis of analysis of the data received from various sources including different Departments and of the demands, representations and review of literature related to the subject. The recommendations of the Commission regarding classification of Scheduled Castes reservation in Govt. jobs were considered by the State Government. After the approval of Council of Ministers, it has been decided that—

- (i) For the purpose of reservation in services, the Scheduled Castes in Haryana will be sub-categorized in two categories i.e. Deprived Scheduled Castes (DSC) and Other Scheduled Castes (OSC).
- (ii) List of Deprived Scheduled Castes and Other Scheduled Castes has been enclosed at **Annexure-A** of these instructions.
- (iii) Within the existing 20% quota reserved for Scheduled Castes in direct recruitment to Govt. jobs, one-half of the posts will be reserved for candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes. If and only if suitable candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes are not available, then suitable candidates of Other Scheduled Castes may be recruited against the balance vacant posts.
- (iv) Similarly, one-half of the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes shall be reserved for candidates belonging to Other Scheduled Castes. If and only if suitable candidates of Other Scheduled Castes are not available, then suitable candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes may be recruited against the balance vacant posts.
- (v) The combined merit list of the candidates belonging to Deprived Scheduled Castes and Other Scheduled Castes selected/recommended by the Recruiting Agency will

be prepared and inter-se seniority of such candidates will also be fixed on the basis of merit.

- (vi) It will not be necessary to fix the roster points separately for each of the sub-categories within the present roster system.
- (vii) If on a particular occasion the total number of vacant posts (cadre wise) meant for Scheduled Castes is odd, say 9, then 5 of them will go to Deprived Scheduled Castes and 4 posts to Other Scheduled Castes. On the next such occasion, however, the position would be reversed, i.e. 4 of them will go to Deprived Scheduled Castes and 5 posts to Other Scheduled Castes.
- (viii) After the issue of these instructions, the first vacant post reserved for Scheduled Castes will be allocated to Deprived Scheduled Castes without any change in the roster point already maintained by the Department.

2. These instructions will be applicable with immediate effect and Annexure-B of instructions bearing No. 22/10/2013-1GS-III, dated 15.07.2014 in which the list of castes which are to be treated as Scheduled Castes in Haryana State has been specified for the purpose of reservation in jobs under Government/Government Undertakings and Local Bodies as well as for admission in Government/Government aided educational/technical professional institutions, will be deemed to have been replaced with the Annexure-A of these instructions.

3. These instructions may please be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.

I hereby declare that I have not been expelled or debarred from admission in any Institution in the country on account of being found guilty of, abetting or being part of a conspiracy to promote, ragging; and further affirm that, in case the declaration is found to be untrue, I am aware that my admission is liable to be cancelled.

**GUIDELINES FOR SC/DSC SCHOLARSHIP
GOVT. OF INDIA POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR SCHEDULED CASTES
STUDENTS**

I. Conditions of Eligibility

- (i) The scholarships are open to nationals of India.
- (ii) These scholarships will be given for the study of recognized post-matriculation for post-secondary programmes pursued in recognized institution with the following exception. "Scholarships are not awarded for training programmes like aircraft maintenance Engineer's Programmes and Private pilot license Programmes. Programmes at Training ship dufferin (Now Rajendera) Programmes of training at the Military College, Dehradun, programmes at pre-examination Training Centers of all India State levels."
- (iii) Only those candidates who belong to Scheduled Caste so specified in relation to the State/Union Territory to which the applicant actually belongs i.e. permanently settled and who have passed the matriculation or Higher Secondary Education, will be eligible.
- (iv) Candidates who after passing one stage of education are studying in the same stage of education in different subject e.g. MSc after BA or B.Com. and after BA or MA in other subject will not be eligible.
- (v) Students who after having completed their educational career in one professional line. e.g. LLB. after B.T. /B.Ed. will not be eligible from the academic year 1980-81, studies in two professional programmes are allowed.
- (vi) Students studying in Class XI of the Higher Secondary School programmes of the XII class of the multipurpose high school will not be eligible for it being a continuous school programme. However, in cases where tenth Class examination of such programmes is treated as equivalent to Matriculation and students who after passing tenth class join other programmes, such students will be treated as post-matric students and will be eligible for the award of scholarships.
- (vii) Students pursuing Post graduate programmes in medicine will be eligible if they are not allowed to practice during the period of their programme.
- (viii) Students who after failing or passing the under graduate/Post- graduate examinations in Arts/ Science/Commerce join any recognized professional or Technical certificate/ diploma/ degree programmes will be awarded scholarships if otherwise eligible. No subsequent failure will be condoned except programmes in Group 'I'.
- (ix) Students who pursue their studies through correspondence programmes are also eligible. The term correspondence includes distant and continuing education.
- (x) Employed students whose income combined with the income of their parents/guardians does not exceed the maximum prescribed income ceiling are made eligible to post-matric scholarships to the extent of reimbursement of all compulsorily payable non-refundable fees.
- (xi) All children of the same parents/guardians will be entitled to receive benefits of the scheme.
- (xii) A scholarship holder under this scheme will not hold any other scholarship/stipend. If awarded any other scholarship/ stipend, the student can exercise his/her and should inform the awarding authority through the Head of the Institution about the option made. No scholarship /stipend whichever is more beneficial to him/her and should inform the awarding authority through the head of the Institution about the option made. No scholarship will be paid to the students under this scheme from the dates he/she accepts another scholarship/stipend. The students can however, accept free lodging or a grant or adhoc monetary help from the state Government or any other source for the purchase of books, equipment or for meeting the expenses on board and lodging in addition to the scholarship amount paid under this scheme.
- (xiii) Scholarship holders who are receiving coaching in any of the pre-examination training

centers with financial assistance from the Central Government/ State Government will not be eligible for stipend under the coaching schemes for the duration of the coaching programmer.

Note: It is mentioned under the item III (condition of eligibility) of these regulations that the Scholarship will be given for the study of all recognized post-matriculation or post-secondary programmes pursued in recognized institutions, the list of programmes grouped (1 to IV) is only illustrative and not exhaustive. The State Governments/ Union territory Administrations are, thus, themselves competent to decide the appropriate grouping of programmes at their level as advised vide this Ministry's letter No. 11017/13/88 Sch Cell, dated 3.8.1989.

II. OTHER CONDITIONS FOR THE AWARD

1. The scholarship is dependent on the satisfactory progress and conduct of the scholar. If it is reported by the head of the Institution at any time that a scholar has by reasons of his/her own act of default failed to make satisfactory progress or has been guilty of misconduct such as resorting to or participating in strikes, irregularity in attendance without the permission of the authorities concerned etc, the authority sanctioning the scholarship may either cancel the scholarships or stop or withhold further payment for such period as it may think fit.
2. If a student is found to have obtained a scholarship by false statements, his/her scholarship will be cancelled forthwith and the amount of the scholarship paid will be recovered, at the discretion of the concerned State Government. The student concerned will be blacklisted and debarred for scholarship in any scheme forever.
 - i) A scholarship awarded may be cancelled if the scholar changes the subject of the programme of study for which the scholarship was originally awarded or changes the Institution of study, without prior approval of the State Government. The Head of Institution shall report such cases to them and stop payment of the scholarship money. The amount already paid may also be recovered at the discretion of the State Government.
 - ii) A Scholar is liable to refund the scholarship amount at the discretion of the State Government, if during the programme of the year, the studies for which the scholarship has been awarded, is discontinued by him/her.
 - iii) The regulations can be changed at anytime at the discretion of the Government of India.

III. PROCEDURE FOR APPLYING

An application for scholarship should comprise:

- i. One copy of the application for scholarship in the prescribed form (separate application forms as have been prescribed for 'fresh' and renewal scholarship by concerned State/UTs)
- ii. One copy of the passport size photograph with signature of the student thereon (for fresh scholarship)
- iii. One attested copy of certificates, diploma, degree etc in respect of all examinations passed.
- iv. A certificate (in original) of caste duly signed by an authorized Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- v. An income declaration by the self-employed parents/guardians, stating definite income from all sources by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper. Employed parents/guardians are required to obtain income certificate from their employer and for any additional income from other sources. They would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper. Scholarship will be paid to the student whose parents/guardians income from all sources does not exceed **Rs. 2,50,000/-** per annum.
- vi. A receipt in acknowledgement of the scholarship in previous year on the form attached to the application only duly counter-signed by the Head of the institution concerned, if the application was in receipt of a scholarship under this scheme in the preceding year.
- vii. Application complete in all respects shall be submitted to the Head of the Institution, being attended or last attended by the candidates and shall be addressed to an officer specified for this

purpose to the Government of State/union territory to which the student belongs, in accordance with the instructions issued by them from time to time.

(For detail of the scheme of the above Scholarship may be consulted from Registration & Scholarship Branch.)

Note: The BC students may also apply for Post Matric Scholarship whose parents' annual income from all sources is less than **Rs. 2,50,000/-** per annum. They will be paid maintenance allowance only.

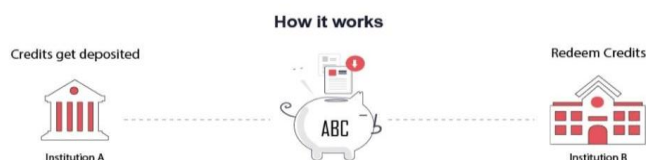
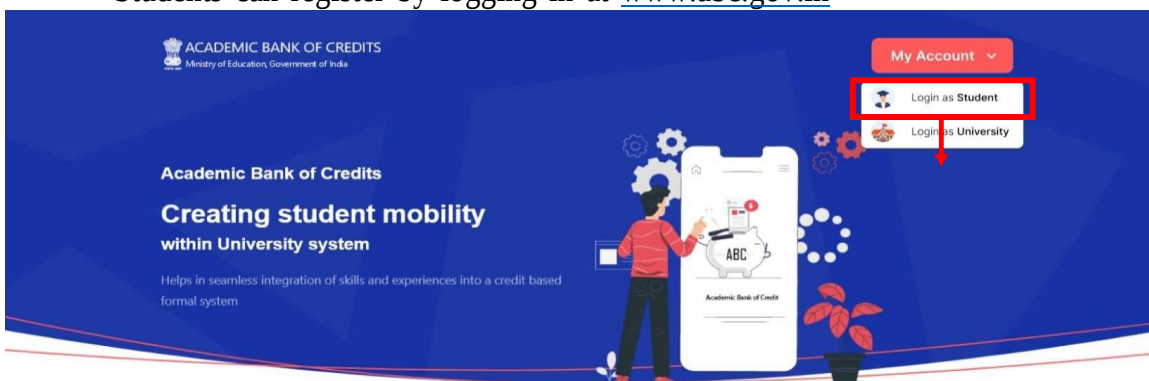
Step after filling Application
